Guided tour to UNFCCC Story Gallery - A History of Climate Change Negotiations

In its short life, the UNFCCC process has made remarkable history and it must continue to do so in the face of the urgent climate challenge. The UNFCCC Story Gallery exists to record that history and recognize the achievements of all those who have been part of the 30 years of climate negotiations. The UNFCCC Story Gallery in AHH Building (at AH Entrance H-107 at UN Campus) presents the history of intergovernmental climate change negotiations and the role of the UN Climate Change Secretariat through original documents, artefacts, rare photographs and video.
