Continuation of National Statements for the first part of the high-level segment for Heads of State and Government

The first part of the high-level segment of COP 26/CMP 16/CMA 3 will continue hearing national statements from Heads of State and Government on Tuesday, 2 November in Plenary Cairn Gorm, beginning at 09.00 hrs.

All speakers should ensure that they are in the plenary room at least four speakers ahead of the delivery of their national statement. They will be escorted by an usher during the presentation of the previous speaker from the seat of their delegation to a reserved chair close to the podium. Speaking slots for those who are not in the plenary at the time for delivery of their statements will be rescheduled to speak at the end of all statements of the same category.

Interludes celebrating action and ambition

At relevant intervals during the World Leaders Summit, leading voices – across business, finance, and civil society – will address participants to celebrate and showcase action and ambition across all three pillars of the Paris Agreement.

Ticket system for NGO and GCA badge holders

Further to the notification on "ensuring transparent and inclusive access to negotiation rooms by all Parties and, where applicable, observers in compliance with COVID-19 measures" yesterday, please note that access restrictions to Zone E and Zone F will remain in place for NGO badge holders and GCA badge holders all day on 2 November, in light of the World Leaders Summit taking place in parallel with the negotiation. This arrangement was upon request from the UN Department of Safety and Security (UNDSS) for the safe and smooth conduct of the Summit. Please find below how the NGO access process works for non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

The UNFCCC process has a scheduling rule of "2+4", i.e., not more than two Contact Groups and 4 informal consultations can be scheduled in parallel. This means, there will be up to 6 negotiation meetings in parallel. Contact Groups are open to observers and in the event that there is no contact group for an agenda item, the SBI recommended that at least the first and the last meetings of the informals may be open to observer organizations, recognizing the right of Parties to keep informal meetings closed.

In order to enable a limited number of NGO badge holders to access negotiation meetings 'in person', each constituency will receive four 'floating' tickets, 36 tickets in total. This means that each constituency can choose four open negotiation meetings out of a maximum of six open negotiation meetings scheduled in parallel. When each constituency representative passes the cordon to the restricted area, staff from the UNDSS will collect the ticket. When they exit the restricted area, the representative needs to re-collect the ticket to transfer it to the next set of four representatives so that they can access the restricted area in the subsequent time slots. This should be repeated for all the negotiation meetings of the day.

In the two meeting rooms that have connecting parallel meeting rooms, there will be seats allocated for the 9 Constituencies. It is, however, expected that with two connecting rooms, representatives can comfortably access these negotiation meetings. For the rest of the meeting rooms, please note that Parties should enter the room first. If space is left, observers will be able to enter. If Parties fill the room and all the seats are taken, observers will not be able to access the meeting room due to COVID code of conduct. Representatives are invited to follow the deliberations on COP 26 virtual platform.

When the first set of negotiation meetings finish, your representatives exit Zone F and re-collect the tickets from the UNDSS staff. Those tickets can be redistributed to the next set of four representatives who cover the topic of the following open negotiation meetings. All negotiation meetings are viewable through virtual platform.

The secretariat appreciates that physical access to negotiation meetings and informal interactions in corridors are an integral part of the work of observers as it is what makes it worthwhile to attend conferences in person. In light of the World Leaders Summit taking place in parallel, however, the secretariat needs to ensure that the safety and security regulations be followed. Thank you for your understanding.
