Daily Programme

Opening of the Resumed high-level segment

The official opening of the resumed high-level segment of COP 26/CMP 16/CMA 3, will take place today, Tuesday, 9 November 2021 in **Plenary Cairn Gorm**, starting at 15.30 hrs.

Participants are asked to take their seats in Plenary Cairn Gorm by 15.15 hrs. to ensure that the opening can begin promptly.

The opening will be presided over by His Excellency Mr. Alok Sharma, President of COP 26/CMP 16/CMA 3 and will be attended by Ms. Patricia Espinosa, UNFCCC Executive Secretary.

The conference will hear national statements from Vice Presidents, Deputy Prime Ministers, Ministers and senior officials of Parties whose Head of State or Government did not deliver a national statement during the first part of the high-level segment held on 1 and 2 November 2021. Statements will also be delivered on behalf of Groups.

Upon conclusion of the delivery of national statements on Wednesday, 10 November, the resumed high-level segment will hear statements by Intergovernmental and non-Governmental organizations admitted by the Conference of the Parties.

Access to Plenary Cairn Gorm for the opening of the resumed high-level segment and to hear delivery of statements can be gained using the plenary access cards which were distributed as of 31 October 2021. All representatives who are not in possession of the access cards are invited to follow the opening on the COP 26 Platform.

Please be advised that COVID-19 guidelines, security and fire regulations do not permit participants to stand and security will enforce this requirement.

The proceedings can be followed on webcast and on the TV screens throughout the Conference Center.

Given the number of Parties and the limited time available for statements, it will be necessary to limit the duration of each statement. Representatives of Parties are reminded that national statements should not exceed the three-minute limit. Representatives of groups are reminded that group statements should not exceed the five-minute limit and observer speakers are reminded that statements should not exceed the two-minute limit. To be fair to all speakers, time limits will be strictly enforced. <u>An electronic/mechanical device will be used to mark the</u> <u>3 minutes allotted to each speaker.</u> This will allow all speakers to deliver their statements.

COP 26 Climate Change Conference participants are invited to the mandated Global Climate Action (GCA) High-Level Event with the participation of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, COP 26 President and other leaders. The GCA High-Level Event, on the penultimate day of COP 26, is to present the Champions' vision for the improvement of the Marrakech Partnership for 2021-2025, showing the clear path ahead to achieve the halving of global emissions and protecting 4 billion people by 2030, while scaling up finance.

Parties, observers and other non-Party stakeholders who wish to take the floor in the GCA High-Level Event are kindly invited to send their requests to make an intervention of no longer than three minutes to <u>globalclimateaction@unfccc.int</u> by **10 November 2021 by 18.00 hrs. (CET)** with suject line "GCA HLE intervention". While efforts will be made to accommodate all requests, given time limitations, priority will be given to requests from Parties.
