### Leaving the UK after COP 26

Delegates are expected to make their own arrangements to leave the UK following COP 26 - please refer to this [planning your journey](#) document for more information.

All COP 26 participants should individually check pre-travel requirements for their onward travel after COP 26. Some countries may require evidence of a negative PCR test to enter. If you require tests to return to your home country, or for onward travel, this will not be provided by the UK Government; COP 26 participants need to arrange and pay for these tests privately. There is no requirement to take a test before leaving the COP 26 conference.

## It's Possible – UN Climate Change's New Podcast

## Light sounds Air

Every night, after delegations have left, the plenary halls are immersed in a sound composition made from the vibrations of plants and trees as they pull CO<sub>2</sub> out of the atmosphere, transforming light into oxygen.

By resonating with nature's creative life-sourcing frequencies, this artwork makes space for the continuous regenerative movement of intelligent systems, sounds of pumping fluids, pulsing root systems, and photosynthesizing aquatic plants, all recorded in forests of the United Kingdom.

Regenerating the entire conference space at night, *Light sounds Air* alludes to the collective power of imagination, the possibility of re-evaluating our place in the universe.
