Special Address by the President of the United States Joseph R. Biden Jr.

His Excellency Joseph R. Biden Jr., President of the United States of America will deliver remarks at the 27th session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP 27). He will discuss efforts to build on the unprecedented work by the United States to reduce emissions, advance the global climate fight and help the most vulnerable build resilience to climate impacts.

A special session will take place today, 11 November 2022 in Plenary Nefertiti. **Doors open at 15.00 hrs.** and close at 16.45 hrs.

Taking into consideration the capacity of the room, and the safety and security of all participants, the event will be ticketed. Parties, United Nations secretariat units and bodies, Specialized agencies and related organizations and Intergovernmental organizations can collect their tickets from the Information Desk, located in Area B of the conference venue. **Tickets can be collected today, 11 November from 10.00 – 13.00 hrs.**

COP 27 President His Excellency Mr. Sameh Shoukry and United States Special Presidential Envoy for Climate Mr. John Kerry are hosting a special event on "Advancing Adaptation Action in Africa", which will include the announcement of a full package of support, pledges, and initiatives to accelerate adaptation in the African continent. The event will take place today, 11 November from 18.15 – 19.00 hrs. in Plenary Nefertiti.

This will be immediately followed from 19.05 – 19.50 hrs. by a special event hosted by Egypt and the United States on **"Accelerating mitigation ambition while ensuring energy security"**, which will focus on support for the NWFE program in Egypt and will also include a segment on reducing methane emissions.
