Ongoing Work under the CDM Executive Board (EB)

CDM EB

Supervises the Kyoto Protocol's CDM under the **authority and guidance of the CMP**. The EB is fully accountable to the CMP and is the ultimate point of contact for CDM project participants for the registration of projects and the issuance of CERs.

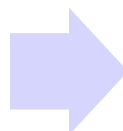
EB108

Agreed on temporary measures to apply to CDM activities after 2020 until new decisions from CMP.



EB113

Mandate for the Secretariat: Prepare a concept note on possible future activities of the CDM for expedited implementation of the A6.4 Mechanism and for the management of the CDM process, including de-registration of registered CDM project activities and PoAs that have transitioned to the A6.4 Mechanism.



EB117

Mandate for the Secretariat: to prepare a concept note on issues related to the transition of CDM activities to the A6.4 mechanism (temporary measures and CERs transfer to the A6.4 mechanism registry, considering the interlinkage and collaboration between CDM EB and the A6.4 SB



EB118

Cease receiving requests under the temporary measures when the process for submission of transition requests to the secretariat, under the A6.4 mechanism, becomes operational. (After June 30, 2023).

Discussion on deregistration of transitioning activities.

Submission of requests for registration, issuance and renewal of afforestation and reforestation activities are not allowed under the temporary measures.

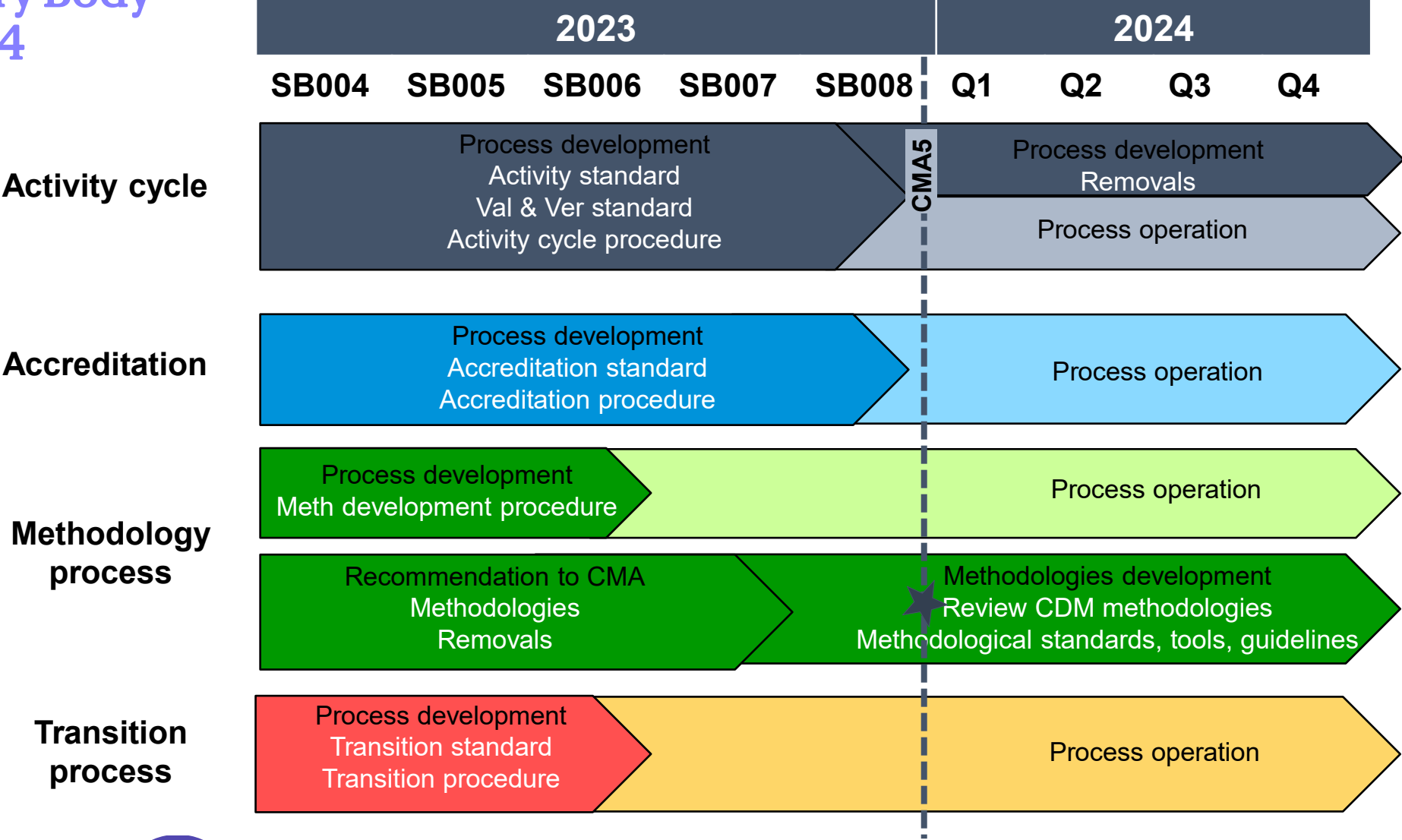

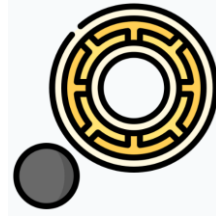

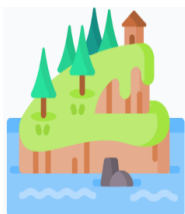

Least Developed Countries & Small Island Developing States

The SB requested the secretariat to include components that recognize the special circumstances LDCs and SIDS where the Article 6.4 mechanism RMPs relate to NDCs.



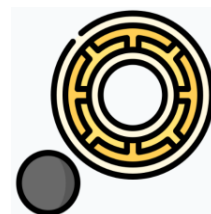
Gender

- **Decision 3/CMA.3 para. 5(i)** – Requests the SB to consider the gender action plan and the incorporation of relevant actions into the work of the Supervisory Body
- SB Work plan – Concept note on gender action plan to be considered in SB 006 (July 2023)



Small and Micro businesses

The SB agreed to consider the inclusion of provisions that specifically address small-scale and micro-scale activities as a means of supporting these businesses in the development methodologies, on a case-by-case basis.



Local Communities & Indigenous Peoples

- **Decision 3/CMA.3 para. 5(h)** – Requests the SB to consider opportunities to engage with the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform and its Facilitative Working Group
- SB Work plan – Concept note on engagements with LCIPP to be considered in SB 006 (July 2023)



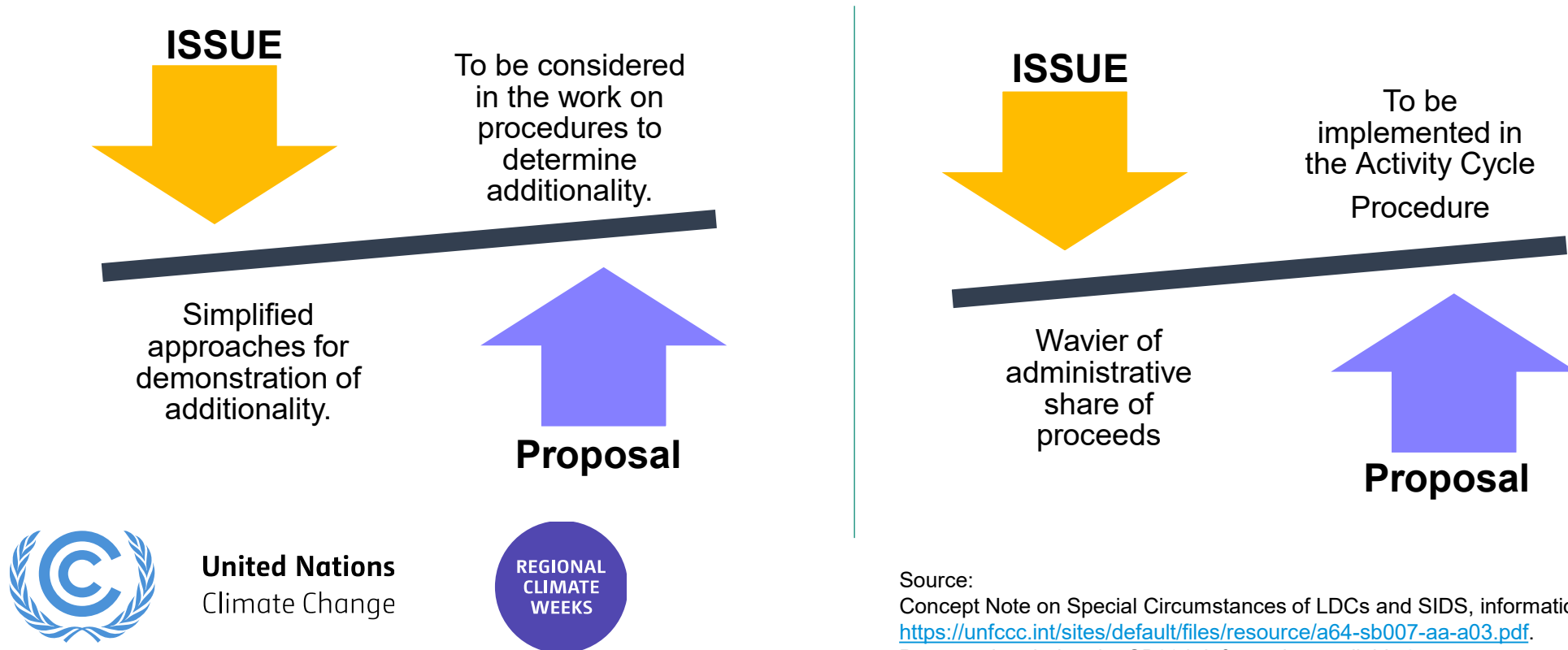

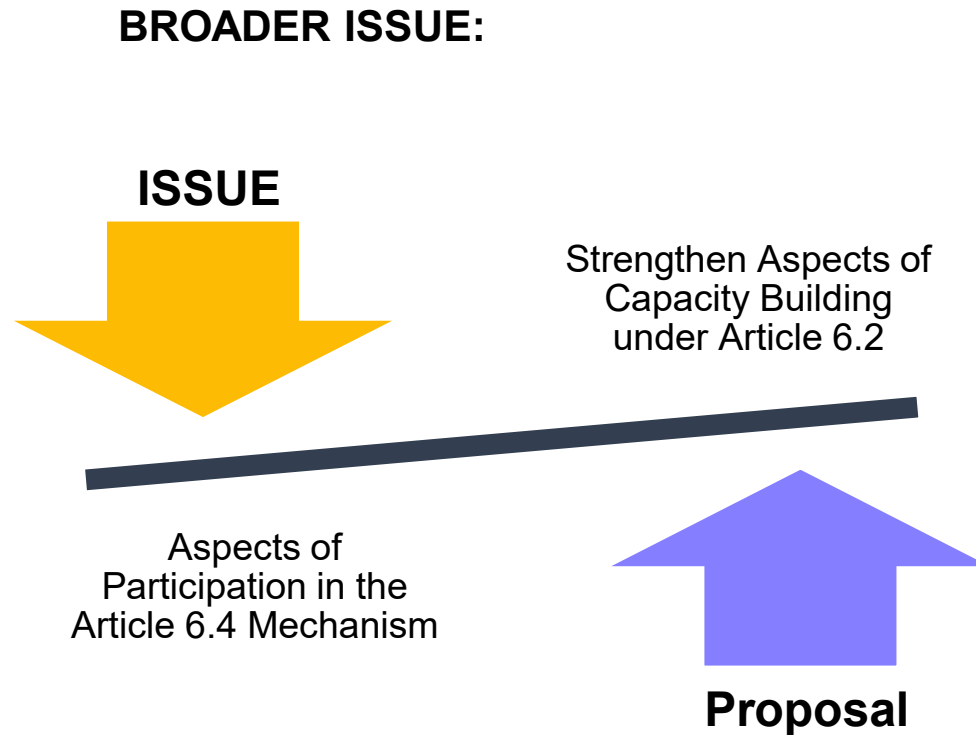
