#### Context

- Common nomenclatures are outlined in Chapter II.B, annex I, 6/CMA.4. and on Chapter II.B.d in the technical paper.
- The CARP will house and be used to manage the common list of values.
- They are a key element of reporting as per decision 2/CMA.3, annex, chapter IV (Reporting).
- The secretariat and Parties can identify the need for new common nomenclatures and request their establishment.
  - Elements are robust
  - A manual review of the impact on operations is a must.
  - Assessment of possible remediations or mitigations.
  - Carried out by the secretariat.
  - Consultations with involved participating Parties, as necessary.


- Initiation: Parties engage in a cooperative approach
- Registration request: One Party accesses the CARP and fills in the form:
  - Name of the cooperative approach
  - List of participating Parties
- Verification by the secretariat: Looks for typographical errors, or duplications and request the other participating Parties in the cooperative approach their approval.
- Notification to Parties: Parties involved in the cooperative approach receive a
  notification indicating if the cooperative approach has been registered successfully or
  not, as well as the code of that cooperative approach for reporting.

































































The common nomenclature for the cooperative approaches:

- represents the initial position of the ITMO serial number or ITMO international ID.
- is part of the AEF in combination with the cooperative approach's name
- will play a key role in generating the summary tables derived from the AEF


The "FROM WHOM", "TO WHOM", "FOR WHAT" and "WHEN" are informed in the AEF




Example of ITMO's ID that comprise the minimum elements required in 6/CMA.4

- The minimum information required to declare an ITMO ID was determined in 6/CMA.4, but this does not mean that other fields may not be added to the final version of the ITMO ID for transparency proposes
