The InsuResilience Global Partnership was launched in 2017 to strengthen the resilience of developing countries and to protect the lives and livelihoods of poor and vulnerable people from the impacts of disasters. The Partnership promotes the scale-up of pre-arranged, predictable financing for early action, relief and recovery embedded in climate and disaster risk management strategies and the possibility of response to pandemics. As a result, governments and individuals can plan better to manage risks before they occur (ex-ante), reduce the impact of shocks and bounce back better in the face of climate and disaster risk (ex-post).

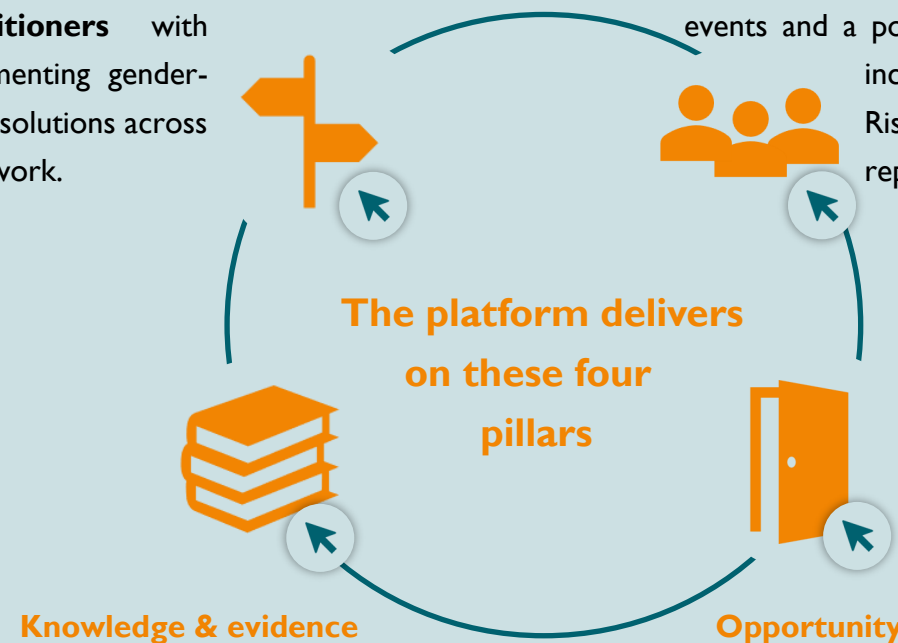
## InsuResilience Centre of Excellence on Gender-smart Solutions
