
Global Progress and Results from the Climate Promise: Gender Integration in NDCs



The Climate Promise is the world's largest offer of support for countries to enhance their pledges (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement.

Active in 120 countries, the Climate Promise facilitates countries to be bolder in reducing emissions, increasing resilience, committing to inclusivity, and protecting nature.

UNDP's Approach to gender-responsive climate action

Governance

Countries have achieved *key gender integration milestones* across governance, policy and planning.

These results are building the institutional capacity and systems to implement and monitor gender-responsive climate action



64% of countries undertook **consultations** with women/women's groups



28% of countries have included **national gender institutions** as part of high-level NDC coordination



30% of countries strengthened **gender mainstreaming** in planning processes



31% of countries undertook a **gender analysis; s**ectors analyzed include:







HONDURAS's NDC recognizes the role and leadership of women...in their diversity as fundamental agents of change in mitigation and adaptation action. These groups will be involved in decision making, planning and implementation of actions.



CAMBODIA's NDC indicates the MRV can track the gender sensitive impact of climate action and effectiveness of gender mainstreaming if appropriate indicators are embedded in M&E frameworks. NDC highlights importance of sex-disaggregated data and proposes numerous gender indicators across adaption sectors.
