TRAINING

✓ Training experts through self-paced courses which aim to strengthen institutional arrangements in developing countries, improve data quality, and increase the transparency of information reported.

PUBLIC AWARENESS

✓ Raising awareness of the benefits of transparency in tracking emissions and impacts, identifying needs and priorities, and tracking progress towards implementation and goals.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

✓ Promoting multi-level cooperation between governments, implementing agencies, research and academic institutions, private sector and support providers for on the ground implementation.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

✓ Enabling effective participation of all relevant stakeholders by inviting them to share perspectives and concrete inputs, including by taking part in the domestic development and review of transparency reports. Encouraging non-Party stakeholders to scale up their own transparency and accountability efforts.

EDUCATION

✓ Promoting the key role of climate change education and of reporting on such activities within countries' efforts on Article 12 of the Paris Agreement, as well as in National Communications.

PUBLIC ACCESS TO INFORMATION

✓ Showcasing information and data reported by countries and reviewed by experts on their GHG emissions, progress towards targets, mitigation actions, climate change impacts and adaptation, and support.

#Together4Transparency unites all stakeholders involved in preparing for and implementing the Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF), raising awareness of the role of data, information and collaboration for the success of the Paris Agreement.
