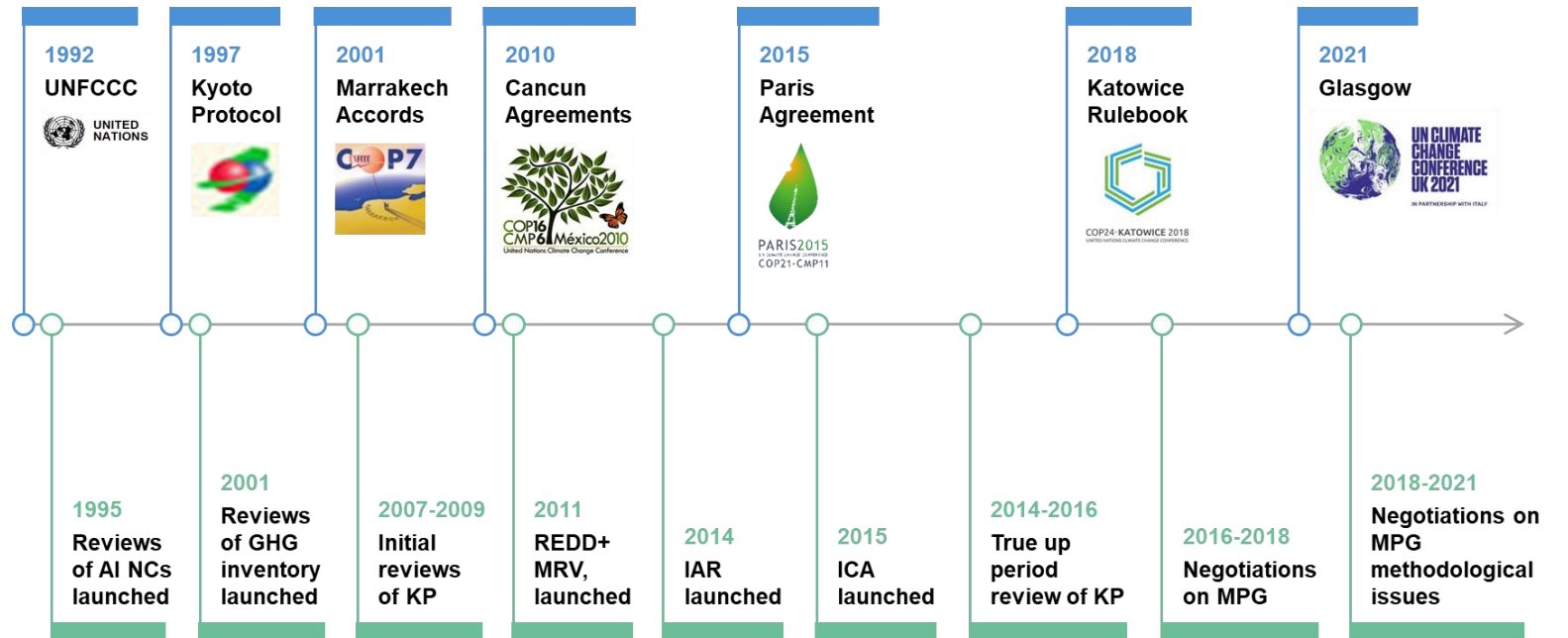


Objective of the information event

Mandate to SBSTA to develop Common Reporting Tables (CRT)

This event supports the work of SBSTA on the development of the Common Reporting Tables (CRT), initiated at SBSTA 50, and continued at SBSTA 51 and in the SBSTA June session

The Modalities, Procedures and Guidelines (MPGs) adopted, as part of the Katowice climate package (decision 18/CMA.1), the rules for the implementation of the ETF under the Paris Agreement

Section II of the MPGs contains guidance for National Inventory Reports (NIR) of anthropogenic emissions by sources and removals by sinks of greenhouse gases (GHGs)

Decision 18/CMA.1, para. 12(a), requested the SBSTA to develop, for consideration and adoption at CMA 3, and pursuant to the MPGs:

CRT for the electronic reporting of the information in NIRs of anthropogenic emissions by sources and removals by sinks of GHGs



SBSTA work and previous events

Support to developing countries and access to CRF Reporter software

SBSTA 50 conclusions:

Para. 121: The SBSTA recognized that in accordance with Article 13, paragraphs 14 and 15, of the Paris Agreement, support shall be provided to developing country Parties for the implementation of Article 13 and for building the transparency-related capacity of developing country Parties on a continuous basis

Para. 127: invited interested developing country Parties to request access to the CRF Reporter, through the secretariat, in order to familiarize themselves with the tool.
