**Procedural summary report on the facilitative, multilateral
consideration of progress at the sixty-fourth session of the Subsidiary
Body for Implementation**

I. Background and mandate

1. Article 13 of the Paris Agreement established the facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress (FMCP) as part of the enhanced transparency framework. The modalities, procedures and guidelines for the transparency framework for action and support referred to in Article 13 of the Paris Agreement include the modalities and procedures for FMCP,¹ according to which FMCP is undertaken, under the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), with the aim of promoting transparency and accountability by facilitating an open exchange with respect to a Party's efforts under Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and implementation and achievement of its nationally determined contribution.²
2. FMCP consists of a written question-and-answer phase and a working group session.³
3. During the period for submitting written questions, which commences three months and concludes two months prior to the working group session, any Party may submit written questions, in accordance with the scope defined in paragraph 1 above, to the Parties undergoing FMCP, which shall make their best efforts to respond in writing to the questions no later than one month prior to the working group session; although developing country Parties that require flexibility in the light of their capacities in this regard may do so up to two weeks prior to the working group session.⁴
4. The working group session takes place during a session of the SBI and consists of a presentation in form of a statement by each Party undergoing FMCP and a discussion. All Parties present may participate in the discussion and ask questions to the Parties concerned.⁵
5. The third working group session for FMCP was organized for 37 Parties: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bhutan, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Costa Rica, Denmark, Ecuador, France, Georgia, Germany, Ghana, Indonesia, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Latvia, Lithuania, Malaysia, Maldives, Mauritius, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Singapore, Sweden, Thailand, Türkiye, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Uruguay and Uzbekistan.
6. The secretariat is mandated to prepare and publish a procedural summary report on the FMCP for the Parties concerned,⁶ which is presented below and available on the web page for the working group session.⁷

II. Written questions and answers

7. The written question-and-answer phase prior to the third working group session for FMCP was launched on 8 March 2026 and 182 questions were submitted to the 37 Parties undergoing FMCP by the following 7 Parties: Australia, Canada, European Union, Japan, New Zealand, Republic of Korea, and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The questions received and the answers provided are available via the web page for the working group session.

III. Working group session

8. The third working group session for FMCP was convened in person at SBI 64 on 10, 12 and 13 June 2026.

9. The working group session, which was open to all Parties and observers attending SBI 64, took place in four parts, the first and third chaired by the SBI Vice-Chair, Eyad Aljubran, and the second and fourth chaired by the SBI Rapporteur, Kamil Salazar.

The statements were followed by a discussion, in which 148 questions were asked by the following 24 Parties: Australia, Austria, Belize, Canada, Cook Islands, Czechia, European Union, Gambia, Germany, Ireland, Japan, Luxembourg, Malawi, Malaysia, Netherlands (Kingdom of the), New Zealand, Norway, Philippines, Poland, Republic of Korea, Samoa, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Owing to time limitations, 42 questions posed to 22 Parties during the discussion could not be addressed during the working group session, for which these Parties were invited to provide written responses following the working group session. The questions asked and the answers provided are available via the web page for the working group session.

In closing the working group session, the SBI Rapporteur, Kamil Salazar, speaking on behalf of the SBI Chair, Julia Gardiner, congratulated the 37 Parties for successfully undergoing FMCP and completing the first cycle of the process under the enhanced transparency framework, namely reporting, review and multilateral consideration of progress. She also thanked all Parties present for engaging in the working group session in a facilitative manner and the secretariat for its support in organizing it.
