SBI 60 agenda item 4(b) Reporting from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention: Provision of financial and technical support

- 1. The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) welcomed the information provided by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) in its reports to the Conference of the Parties at its twenty-eighth session and SBI 60 on financial support requested, approved and provided for the preparation of national communications (NCs) and biennial update reports (BURs) by Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (non-Annex I Parties), including support provided through the joint programme of the Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency and the Global Support Programme for Preparation of National Communications and Biennial Update Reports by non-Annex I Parties.
- 2. The SBI also welcomed the oral report by the secretariat on technical support provided to non-Annex I Parties to enhance their capacity for reporting under the Convention.
- 3. The SBI underscored the importance of the provision of adequate and timely financial and technical support to non-Annex I Parties, and of streamlining and simplifying the existing procedures of the GEF and its implementing agencies, as well as of exploring alternative programming modalities, procedures and processes, in accordance with the GEF mandate, in order to facilitate and expedite the access of developing country Parties to financial resources, enabling them to meet their measurement, reporting and verification obligations under the Convention and building and enhancing their institutional and technical capacity on a continuous basis.
- 4. The SBI noted that non-Annex I Parties continue to face challenges in reporting under the Convention and require further support to enhance their domestic capacity for and ensure continuity in meeting their reporting requirements, including for establishment and enhancement of national reporting systems within their national Governments.
- 5. [Recalling paragraphs 38–46 of decision 1/CP.24, the SBI underscored the importance of providing support for addressing the challenges referred to in paragraph 4 above to non-Annex I Parties that are also Parties to the Paris Agreement in an integrated manner to enable them to fulfil their reporting obligations under both the Convention and the Paris Agreement.]
- 6. The SBI acknowledged the financial, technical and capacity-building support available through bilateral, multilateral and other channels for enhancing the capacity of non-Annex I Parties to address the challenges referred to in paragraph 4 above.
- 7. The SBI requested the secretariat to provide, in collaboration with United Nations agencies and other organizations, further technical support to non-Annex I Parties[, recognizing the special circumstances of the least developed countries and small island developing States,] for their reporting under the Convention.
- 8. [Recalling Article 4, paragraph 3, of the Convention, the SBI urged Parties included in Annex II to the Convention to provide financial resources for the support referred to in paragraphs 4–5 above.]
- 9. The SBI noted that, as at 11 June 2024, 448 NCs (i.e. 154 NC1s, 146 NC2s, 105 NC3s, 36 NC4s, 5 NC5s and 2 NC6s) and 191 BURs (i.e. 102 first BURs, 44 second BURs, 28 third BURs, 13 fourth BURs and 4 fifth BURs) had been submitted by non-Annex I Parties.³
- 10. The SBI took note of the estimated budgetary implications of the activity to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in paragraph 7 above.
- 11. The SBI requested that the actions of the secretariat called for in these conclusions be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.
