- They are 47 in number
- 33 found in Africa
- 13 in Asia
- 1 in the Americas, Haiti

Forests - DRC

Plains

Oil producing

Agricultural

Highly dependent on the exploitation of natural resources

Varying interests and priorities

Fragile economy

Challenges faced by LDCs

- Limited understanding and attention to the impact of implementation of response measures
- Varying priorities and interests of country Parties
- Inadequate efforts to address adaptation and mitigation How can the bring on board RM when even Loss and damage are not addressed.
- Limited information and evidence on the impact of Implementation of RM
- Lack of research and studies to inform actions and policy formulation and implementation in developing countries
- Limited measures to mitigate the adverse impacts
- Limited capacity to assess the impacts

Take-home recommendations

- Enhanced awareness campaign
- Enhanced mobilisation of resources from both global and domestic sources
- Catalyze zeal and interests of the negotiators
- Integrate impact of implementation of RM in the national development plans
- Mobilise more technical and financial support
- Intensify research and studies to enable assessment of the impacts
- Develop guidelines and framework for mitigating the impacts
- Engage local and regional research institutions in impact assessment

Conclusion

- Impact of implementation is a reality and can undermine realisation of sustainable development
- As parties mitigate and adapt to the adverse effects of response measures they should map out ways of maximising the positive impacts and minimising the negative impacts
- LDCs should focus more attention to the subject of response measures and join in the UNFCCC negotiation process
- Identify and establish specific fund to address the impact of implementation of response measures
- All mitigation and adaptation proposals should factor in the impacts of implementation of response measures
