

Provide clarity on **support** provided and received by relevant individual Parties in the context of climate change actions and, to the extent possible, to provide a full overview of aggregate financial support provided, to inform the GST




## Transition from MRV to the ETF

## Article 13 of the Paris Agreement: transparency of action and support

\* The transparency framework shall provide flexibility in the implementation of the provisions of this Article to those developing country Parties that need it in the light of their capacities {Article 13.2};

he transparency framework shall recognize the special circumstances of the least developed countries and small island developing States {Article 13.3}.

A. National circumstances, institutional arrangements and legal frameworks

- B. Impacts, risks and vulnerabilities, as appropriate
- **C. Priorities and barriers**
- D. Adaptation strategies, policies, plans, goals and actions to integrate adaptation into national policies and strategies
- E. Progress on implementation of adaptation
- F. Monitoring and evaluation of adaptation actions and processes
- G. Information related to averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with climate change impacts
- H. Cooperation, good practices, experience and lessons learned

I. Any other relevant information


These sections can help to:

- **Identifying and gaining** recognition of adaptation efforts of developing countries;
- Setting the scene or telling the adaptation story of the country, giving context to the plans, efforts and strategies;
- Developing the country narrative of progress in relation to the information provided in other adaptation related instruments and planning processes;
- Targeting support needs to meet adaptation priorities, including challenges, gaps, and barriers to adaptation;
- Providing information about good practices, experiences and lessons learned in the implementation of adaptation actions.
