Greenhouse gas data interface

Option 1:

1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) reaffirmed the importance of greenhouse gas (GHG) emission data being easily accessible in the GHG data interface.¹
2. The SBSTA requested the secretariat to further develop the GHG data interface to incorporate data reported by Parties under the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement.
3. The SBSTA took note of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in paragraph 2 above.
4. The SBSTA requested that the actions of the secretariat called for in these conclusions be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.

Option 2:

1. The SBSTA agreed that further development of the GHG data interface is no longer necessary.

Option 3:

1. The SBSTA agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBSTA 62 (June 2025).

Option 4:

1. The SBSTA requested the secretariat to prepare a workplan for further developing the GHG data interface, incorporating data and information reported by Parties under the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement. Each phase of the workplan should include timelines and cost estimates for implementation and be presented to Parties at SBSTA 62 (June 2025).

2. The SBSTA agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBSTA 62.
