Background

1. In 2016, the COP decided that annual in-session workshops would be held in conjunction with the sessions of the subsidiary bodies in 2018 and 2019.¹ In 2017, the COP decided that the topic of the workshop in 2019 would be on the short- and long-term impacts of the gender action plan.²
2. In 2018, the COP requested the SBI at SBI 50 to initiate the review of the areas of progress, areas for improvement and further work to be undertaken under the Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan on the basis of all submissions received and reports produced under the Lima work programme and its gender action plan, with a view to the SBI forwarding recommendations on the outcome of the review for consideration and adoption at COP 25.³

Objectives

3. The workshop aims to:
 - a. Provide an opportunity for those Parties and entities who have invested or participated in activities in support of the LWGP and GAP to showcase their action and share experiences.
 - b. Provide data and information on the successes and challenges in implementing the Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan, the short- and long-term impacts, as an input to the review of the LWGP and GAP to be initiated at SBI 50.
