

**Informal note by the co-facilitators
on**

**SBI 62 agenda item 18
Gender and climate change**

Version 21/6/2025 16:00

1. The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) initiated the development of a new gender action plan at this session taking into account the inputs to and outcome of the review of the enhanced Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan in 2024¹ and the discussions at the in-session technical workshop to facilitate the design of gender action plan² activities held at this session.³
2. The SBI welcomed with appreciation Parties' and observers' participation in and contributions to the workshop referred to in paragraph 0 above above.
3. The SBI expressed gratitude to the German Agency for International Cooperation for its financial support for the workshop.
4. The SBI recalled that other in-person or hybrid technical workshops to facilitate the design of gender action plan activities may be held during 2025 in conjunction with existing events, at the discretion of the Chair of the SBI upon receiving an expression of interest from a Party to host such a workshop.⁴
5. The SBI agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBI 63 (November 2025) on the basis of the informal note prepared by the co-facilitators for this agenda item at this session,⁵ with a view to recommending a draft decision on the new gender action plan for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the Parties at its thirtieth session (November 2025).

Further elements for gender action plan activities were identified:

- Create WEHRD climate champion's role and appoint champions
- Strengthen participation and ensure local, grassroots and marginalized communities, including women and girls and gender-diverse people's full and meaningful participation in technology development and transfer activities in all stages, such as trainings, workshops and peer to peer exchanges
- Parties to exchange experiences/lessons learnt on successful funding strategies, such as project proposals writing, identification and allocation of existing funds, and access to finance, to develop and implement activities under national gender action plans and the gender action plan
- Exchange of knowledge on funding access modalities and reimagining funding together with Parties, observers and implementing entities to enhance grassroots organizations' and Indigenous Peoples and local communities' access to finance
- Develop a gender indicator framework that it is culturally sensitive and adaptable to national context and establish a technical working group
