Mali's participation in the Article 6.4 mechanism of the Paris Agreement offers several potential benefits for sustainable development. This mechanism will facilitate the transfer of clean and innovative technologies, thereby supporting emissions reduction and local economic development in areas such as waste management, renewable energy, and energy efficiency. It will also promote the creation of green jobs in sectors like renewable energy and sustainable agriculture, thus enhancing economic resilience. Furthermore, participation in this mechanism will enable the development of local skills through training and knowledge transfer, which is essential for the effective implementation of emissions reduction projects. Projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions contribute to improved air quality and, consequently, living conditions, with positive effects on public health. Additionally, some projects can strengthen climate change adaptation by enhancing the resilience of infrastructures and local communities.

Mali plans to approve several types of activities under Chapter V.C of the Rules, Modalities, and Procedures (RMPs) of Article 6.4. These activities include renewable energy projects, such as the installation of solar, wind, and hydroelectric power plants, to reduce dependence on fossil fuels. Waste management initiatives will aim to improve the collection, sorting, and valorization of waste to reduce methane and other greenhouse gas emissions. Sustainable agriculture and forestry projects will introduce practices to reduce CO₂ emissions and increase carbon sinks. Additionally, energy efficiency programs will be implemented to improve efficiency in industrial and residential sectors, thereby reducing energy consumption and associated emissions. These activities will directly contribute to Mali's Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) by providing means to achieve emission reduction targets. Mali is also preparing its low greenhouse gas emission development strategy, and these activities can align with this strategy by promoting sustainable and low-carbon economic development. By supporting real and measurable reductions in greenhouse gas emissions, these activities will contribute to the long-term goals of the Paris Agreement, aiming to limit global warming to well below 2°C.
