

## EU vision



- ACE is key for developing & implementing **effective climate policy**
- Build understanding & support for the transition to a low emission society
- Encourage Parties to further integrate ACE into mitigation and adaptation policies at domestic level
- Enhance **stakeholder engagement** in climate policy & Paris Agreement work programme
- Under PAWP, ACE should not be dealt with in isolation but be integrated in a **cross-cutting way**

# ACE in domestic planning processes



- Ensure public participation in planning processes related to NDCs, Adaptation, and Long Term Strategies
- EU example:
  - Direct consultation with non-Party stakeholders
  - Internet consultation
  - Legislative proposal & impact assessments publicly available
  - Public hearings
  - Additional participation procedures at Member State level
- Include ACE activities in national climate plans and policies

### ACE in the PAWP



- <u>Transparency framework</u>: explore options for involving relevant stakeholders in the establishment of domestic MRV systems and in the facilitative multilateral consideration of progress
- <u>Global Stocktake</u>: non-Party stakeholder contributions can help raise awareness on opportunities for enhanced action
- <u>Mechanisms under article 6.4</u>: ensure transparency of decisionmaking and local stakeholder consultations
