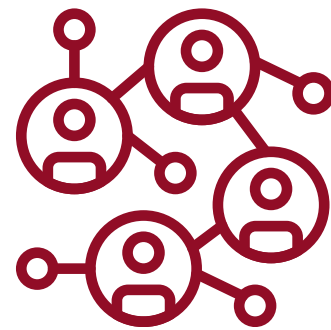


"Reaping the Potential of Entrepreneurship for a Climate-Smart Inclusive Green Economy in South Africa" (ECSIGE)

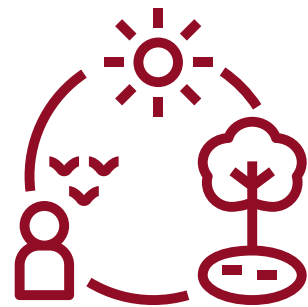

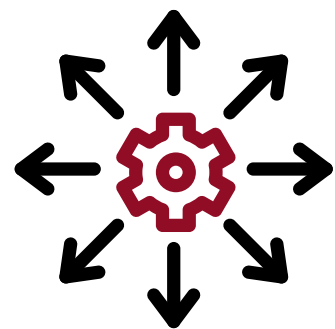
THE IMPERATIVES OF CIVIL SOCIETY COLLABORATION



Adopting a developmental ecosystem building model: the success of projects and entrepreneurial activity depends on the existence and active working together of all elements of a system



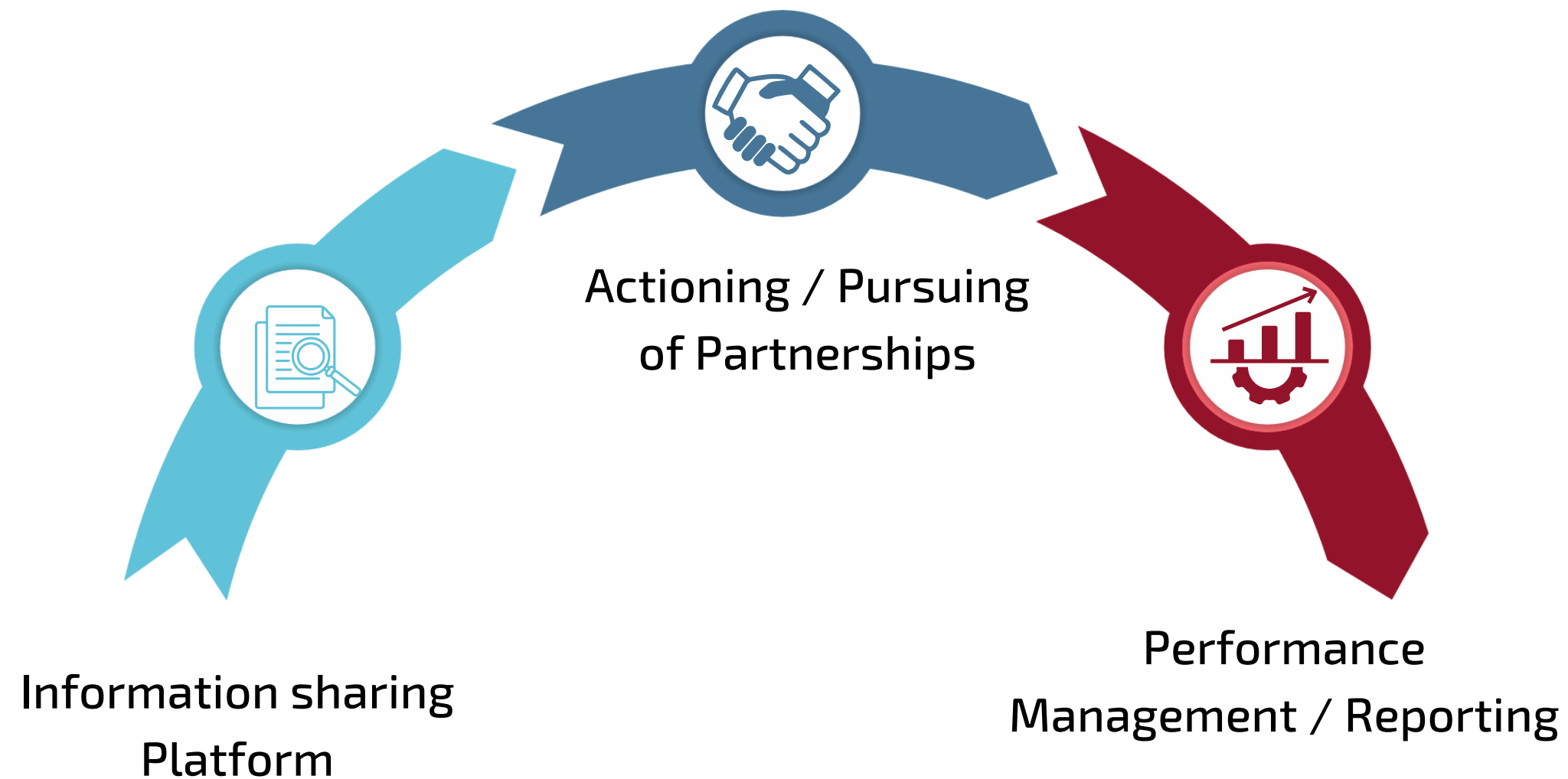

The system may not be perfect – but that is ok – the idea is not to have a perfect system – but work with each other' strength to enhance outcomes and or expand the pie

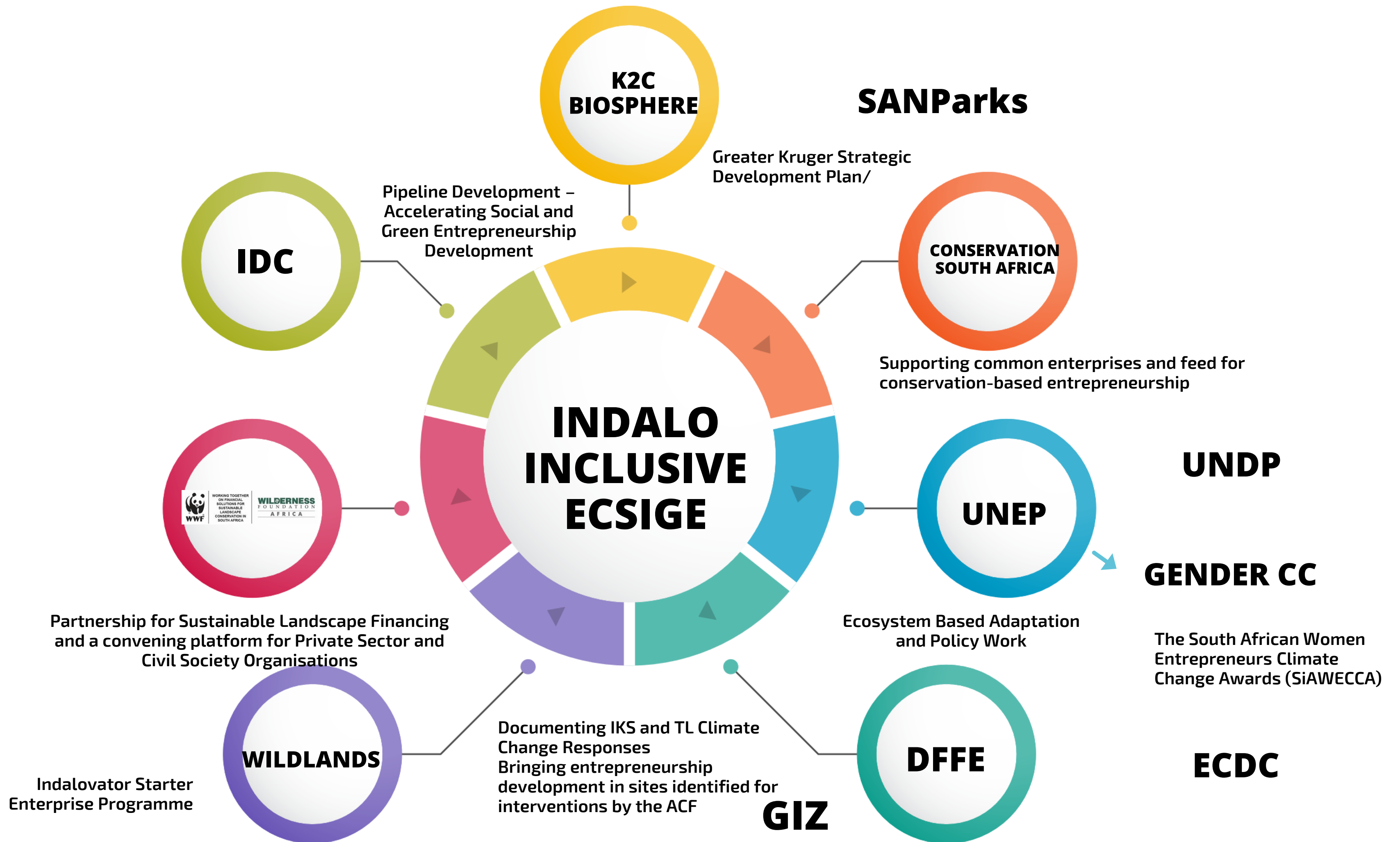

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About this Session

If the recent floods in KwaZulu- Natal are anything to go by, we are all sure that we need to do more to develop our capacity for handling anything that is thrown our way in CSI today. The floods fell at the back of a receding pandemic and was ridden by the looting of July 2022.

It is clear that we have to be prepared for a lot more than just building houses and providing school shoes and uniforms. We now need to have the conversation on the environment, looking at the PPP model in a more holistic and realistic way.

Indalo Inclusive, Nedbank and Government of Flanders have been at the forefront of the green economy development with some amazing programmes led by incredible women. There is no better time for our industry to learn who are the key figures and frontrunners of this part of the sector. While the COVID-19 pandemic has been raging, a longer term pandemic has been fomenting on our doorstep in the form of climate change. What the Audience Should Leave With

Success is measured differently by all of us, but we must leave the audience feeling that their personal success is attainable.

They can achieve more if they try. We need the audience to know that there is a lot of machinery that drives success and what that machinery looks like in real life. For example: working all night, researching, reading, attending seminars and workshops, and spending a lot of money on self-development.

No matter what the level of success, it has common ground, and even though we all have our own ceiling of success, the truth is that all success has common ground. It starts with self, working hard, researching, reading and so on. The audience must be left knowing that, ultimately, success is in their hands.

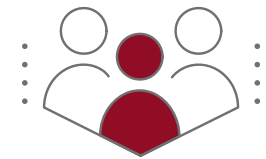

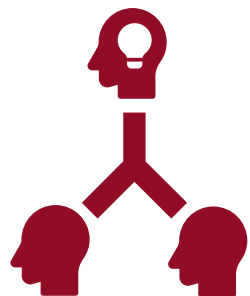

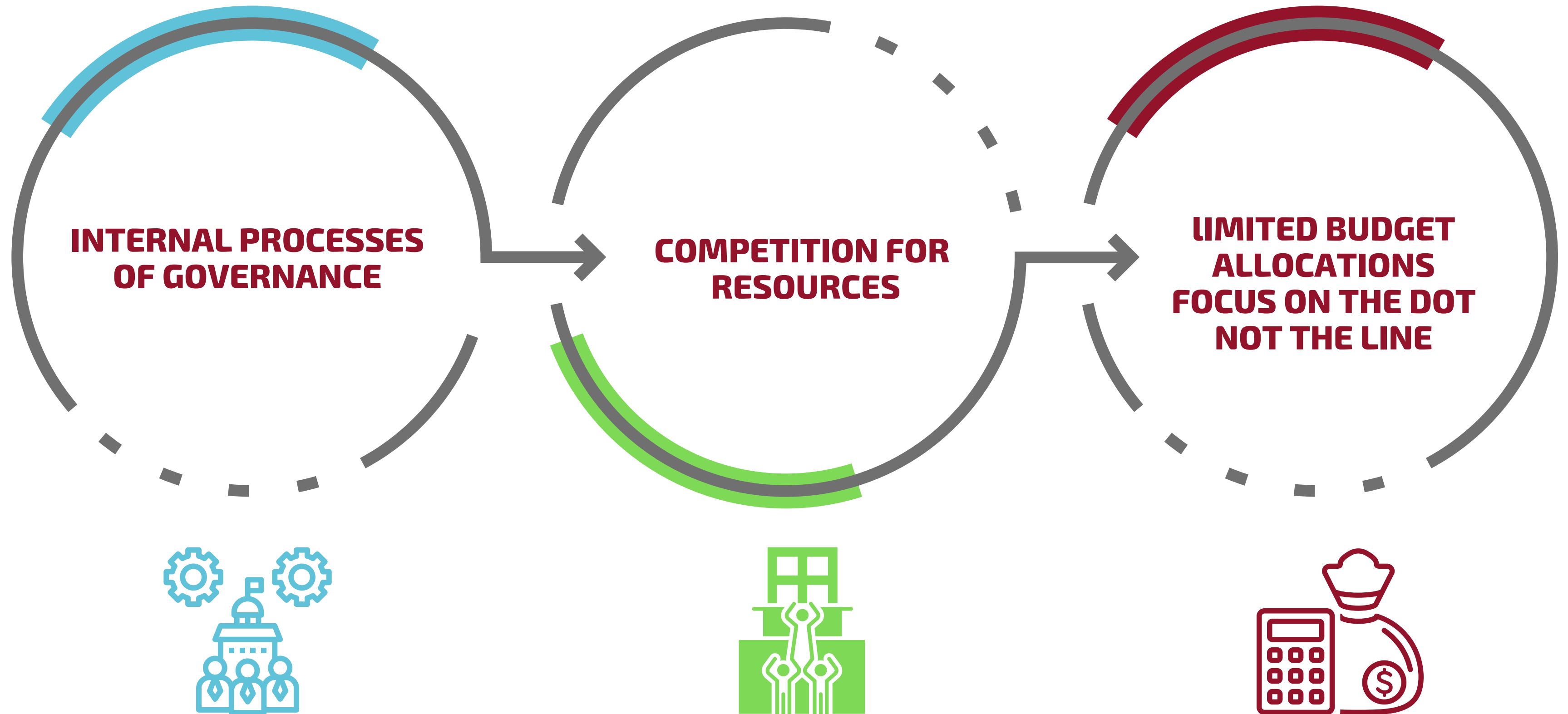
