

**Call for inputs on reporting and informing on efforts to assess and analyze the impacts of the implementation of response measures**

This note includes UNCTAD response to the call for inputs on reporting and informing on efforts to assess and analyze the impacts of the implementation of response measures, shared by the Co-Chairs of the Katowice Committee on Impacts (KCI) in their letter from 10 January 2024.

**Question 1:** What are processes in place in your country or organization to systematically identify or collect information on social and economic consequences of impacts of implementation of response measures?

UNCTAD, in collaboration with partners propose to use the [Climate Transition Impact Framework \(C-TIF\)](#) forward-looking approach to compare the potential socioeconomic impacts of different climate action pathways. The Framework would allow Parties to increase the understanding of the national socioeconomic impacts of climate action pathways to delineate the trade-offs and synergies that decision makers should consider in the design of response measures. It aims to equip climate action policy makers with an holistic quantitative fact base data of the transition's impacts on people. The Framework considers an initial list of 50 metrics across five dimensions: affordable energy access, investment requirement, jobs impact, growth and competitiveness, and lived environment and health.

During 2024 and in collaboration with partners, UNCTAD plans to pilot the Framework in five countries from around the world. The model and data will be improved in the process and the results published at COP29. We hope this can then be rolled out to all developing countries on a demand basis.
