I: Introduction and background

- The AC agreed to prepare a report on various approaches to adaptation, such as community-based adaptation (CBA) and ecosystem-based adaptation (EbA), taking into account livelihoods and economic diversification (LED)
- Following a discussion of the draft report at its 13th meeting, the AC provided further guidance to the secretariat to revise the report.
- The Nairobi work programme, its partner organizations and the AC have cooperated and contributed to the growing body of knowledge on various approaches

- Countries need to find the optimal combination of approaches that fit their national circumstances
- Common challenges across the different approaches and how to address them
 - Stakeholder engagement

✓ Engaging locals to national decision-makers for trust and ownership

 \checkmark Using gender sensitivity and culturally appropriate tools for engaging women and vulnerable groups to raise their awareness and avoid maladaptation

> Assessing effectiveness

✓ Reducing burdens for M&E and facilitating synergies between institutions through enhanced coordination

✓ Developing more user-friendly and smart indicators and guidelines

Lack of resources

✓ Financial support from public and private sectors

✓ Building institutional capacity for policy frameworks, human capacity to understand scientific knowledge, and technology for planning and implementing adaptation measures

✤ The AC may choose to:

- Finalise this paper, and decide whether it should be published in a user - friendly format as part of the technical paper on long - term adaptation planning;
- Discuss any follow up that could be undertaken as part of the 2019 2021 workplan, including partnering with organizations specialized in EbA;
- Formulate possible recommendations, in conjunction with the recommendations from the revised technical paper on long - term adaptation planning, for consideration by the COP and interested stakeholders.



The AC may wish to consider the following recommendations on promoting various adaptation approaches to be forwarded to the COP for its consideration:

- a) Invite Parties and relevant institutions to continue developing usable and smart indicators and methodologies to monitor and evaluate positive and negative impacts of the various approaches to adaptation planning;
- b) Invite the NWP and its partner organizations to submit good practices and lessons learned to the Adaptation Knowledge Portal.
