## Possible recommendations

- Encourage Parties to further strengthen their engagement with the private sector in its adaptation efforts, including in the planning, development and implementation of National Adaptation Plans (NAPs)
- Promote the development of knowledge and data that can strengthen the business case for adaptation
- Assist in bridging the finance and data gaps faced by small and medium enterprises looking to undertake adaptation actions
- Utilize a value chain approach when designing and implementing adaptation interventions, recognizing the key role public sector actions can play in stimulating private sector investment
- Strengthening enabling policy environments for adaptation actions in the private sectors through interventions
