"Our Climate! Our Future!" – Youth Dialogue What German Youth Really Think about Climate Change

Did you know that? Youth who took part in the "Our Climate! Our Future!" Youth Dialogue think that Germany should help other countries' climate actions by sharing its experience in the field of renewable energy.

On September 29th, 2017, around 200 young Germans took part in three deliberative events organized by the German Federal Ministry for the Environment (BMUB) in Bochum, Eberswalde and Nuremberg (Germany). They went through a thorough process of information and deliberation before giving their collective judgement on core questions of climate policy.

The Youth Dialogue reveals that the young people want to take an active part in climate politics: The report advocates that youth participation should be made permanent and that elected youth ambassadors should be part of national delegations at climate change conferences.

Their consolidated final report provides unique insights on what the young people see as priorities for global climate action.

The German Ministry for the Environment (BMUB), the UNFCCC Secretariat and the Youth Ambassadors invite you to discuss the core results of the report and what they mean for the COP23.
