COP26 Regional Ambassador Latin America and the Caribbean



H.E. Fiona Clouder, the UK Government's COP26 Regional Ambassador to Latin America and the Caribbean, sat down with RCC Panama to discuss how the UK Government are working with the objectives of the COP26 its preparations for creating focus on finance and how to support and lead for enhanced NDCs.

RCC Panama: Could you tell us about your role as the UK's COP26 Envoy to Latin America?

As Regional Ambassador for Latin America and the Caribbean, I liaise with governments, business and wider society across Latin America and the Caribbean to help build relations, collaboration and understanding on all issues in relation to COP26. The UK is co-hosting

COP26, in partnership with Italy, in November 2021. To promote COP26 objectives, I work in close partnership with the network of UK Embassies, as well as with the UN High Level Champions, UNFCCC Regional Centres and other regional organizations. In taking forward the COP26 negotiations in line with the Paris Agreement (PA), we want to encourage all countries to come forward with ambitious 2030 climate plans (NDCs) and long-term strategies to reach zero carbon emissions as soon as possible. Also to help societies and economies adapt to climate change, particularly the most vulnerable. The UK Presidency is running several campaigns. engaging with a wide variety of stakeholders including businesses, individuals, indigenous groups and young people. There are 5 key themes to encourage ambition and action. These are Adaptation and Resilience, the Energy Transition, Clean Transport, Nature Based Solutions and Finance.

Together with H.E. Fiona Clouder we also conversed about what changes are necessary within climate finance and how UK is supporting that, as well as the role of NDCs and UK's own commitments. The full interview is available here.

Adaptation Gap Report 2020

As temperatures rise and climate change impacts intensify, nations must urgently step up action to adapt to the new climate reality or face serious costs, damages and losses, a new UN Environment Programme (UNEP) report finds. The UNEP <u>Adaptation Gap Report 2020</u> finds that while nations have advanced in planning, huge gaps remain in finance for developing countries and bringing adaptation projects to the stage where they bring real protection against climate impacts such as droughts, floods and sea-level rise.

The report also places a special focus on nature-based solutions as low-cost options that reduce climate risks, restore and protect biodiversity and bring benefits for communities and economies.

Race to Resilience at the Climate Adaptation Summit




The <u>Race to Resilience</u> campaign of the <u>High-Level Champions</u> will be formally introduced at the <u>Climate Adaptation Summit on 25-26 January</u>. It is a sibling to the <u>Race to Zero</u> and aims to catalyze action from non-Party actors to make 4 billion people from vulnerable communities more resilient by 2030. The Summit will also launch the new Adaptation Action Coalition, by the UK with the

Netherlands, Egypt, Bangladesh, Malawi, St Lucia and the UN and a new Adaptation Action Agenda to adapt and build climate resilience by 2030.

One year after its launch the Ministry of Environment of Peru celebrated the first aniversary of the Peru Carbon Footprint with support of the NDC Support Program and UNDP, by hosting a virtual event earlier in January. The event recognized the organizations that have decided to commit to climate action in the country and commit to the fulfillment of Peru's goal of reducing 40% of GHG emissions by 2030 and achieving carbon neutrality by 2050.
