

In response to the request from the co-facilitators, Japan presents its view on the agenda item SBSTA5/SBI11 Glasgow–Sharm el-Sheikh work programme on the global goal on adaptation referred to in decision 7/CMA.3.

Bearing in mind that there are still remaining sessions of the GlaSS workshops, the current SB meeting is better positioned to articulate the contents for the upcoming workshops and, where possible, high-level agreements on the overall structure of the framework for the GGA. As such, the draft conclusion text prepared by SB58 should not prejudice the yet-decided contents or elements of the framework. With this understanding in mind, Japan proposes a possible structure of the draft decision to be included in the conclusion text as follows;

Preambular

1. Welcoming the work under the GlaSS
2. Concluding the GlaSS
3. Acknowledging need to strengthen adaptation action and support at global level under the Paris Agreement
4. Establishing the Framework
5. Setting the purpose of the Framework
6. Defining the elements of the Framework
7. Inviting the Parties to contribute to the success of the Framework and track their progress
8. Recognising the role of various stakeholders towards the success of the Framework (such as the private sector, civil society, youth, women and indigenous people)
9. Deciding that the Framework will complement the GST
10. Streamlining adaptation agenda under the Paris Agreement with the Framework
11. Reviewing the Framework in 2027
