Outcome

Para 8

Request the KCI to propose updates to its rules of procedure for the forum to consider and make recommendations to the SBs with a view to the subsidiary bodies providing recommendations for consideration and adoption by the COP 29, the CMP 19 and the CMA 6

Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI to update at KCI 10 its rules of procedure and may forward them to forum



Outcome

Take note that the forum concluded the midterm review of the workplan of the forum and its KCI and request the forum and its KCI to implement the activities arising from the outcomes of the review contained in annex II.

- Develop a case study in each of the five United Nations regions in accordance with activity 7 of the workplan
- Facilitate the exchange and sharing of experience and best practices in the assessment of the environmental, social and economic co-benefits of climate change policies and actions informed by the best available science, including the use of existing tools and methodologies

The KCI to discuss at KCI 10 the strategy to implement these two activities

The KCI to to implement its capacity-building programme that includes development of modules covering several topics and areas, including just transition

Request the KCI to undertake further research on measuring the potential and actual impacts of response measures on people in vulnerable situations and encourage Parties to consider the results of such research, as appropriate, in the design of response measures and policies to minimize the negative impacts and maximize the positive impacts of response measures on people in vulnerable situations

Possible actions by the KCI

As agreed at KCI 9, the KCI to prepare a policy brief based on this technical paper for activity 9 of the workplan. The KCI, with the support of the secretariat, to conduct research when preparing this policy brief by SB 62

Requests the forum and its KCI to intensify efforts to implement the recommendations outlined in relevant decisions of the Conference of the Parties, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement, including by enhancing cooperation among Parties, stakeholders, external organizations, experts and institutions and by enabling the exchange of information, experience and best practices among Parties with a view to increasing their resilience to the impacts referred to in paragraph 147 above (*i.e. economic and social impacts of the implementation of response measures*)

8. Outcome of the first global stocktake (Decision 1/CMA.5)



Outcome

Para 186

Invites the relevant work programmes and constituted bodies under or serving the Paris Agreement to integrate relevant outcomes of the first global stocktake in planning their future work, in line with their mandates

- 143. Encourages Parties to consider developing, in consultation with technical experts, practitioners and other stakeholders, as appropriate, methodologies and tools, including modelling tools, for assessing and analysing the impacts of the implementation of response measures, with a view to minimizing the negative and maximizing the positive impacts of response measures, with a particular focus on the creation of decent work and quality jobs and on economic diversification.
- 144. Also encourages Parties to develop more national case studies involving the assessment and analysis of the impacts of the implementation of response measures to enable an exchange of experience among Parties on such studies.
- 145. Further encourages Parties, as appropriate, to establish capacity-building partnerships and networks for increasing the number of developing countries that are developing and using methodologies and tools for assessing the impacts of the implementation of response measures.
- 146. Encourages Parties, in their efforts to diversify their economies, to pursue relevant policies in a manner that promotes sustainable development and the eradication of poverty, taking into account national circumstances.
- 147. Also encourages Parties to provide detailed information, to the extent possible, on the assessment of the economic and social impacts of the implementation of response measures.

The KCI to implement its capacity-building programme that includes development of modules covering topics and areas listed under this decision: impact assessments; economic diversification; just transition; stakeholder engagement and collaboration; crosscutting issues.

The KCI, as appropriate, to submit views when specific invitation to provide views is open

12. Matters relating to the Standing Committee on Finance (Decision 5/CP.28)





Para 13

Notes with concern that the draft guidance for the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism prepared by the Standing Committee on Finance was not considered owing to a limited number of submissions and requests Parties and other constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement to provide elements for the draft guidance well in advance of future sessions of the COP and the CMA to enable the Committee to fulfil its mandate in this regard.

Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI, as appropriate, to provide elements for the draft guidance when specific invitation is open

13. Annual technical progress report of the PCCB for 2023 (11/CP.28 and 15/CMA.5)





Outcomes

Para 2

Invites Parties, as appropriate, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, the constituted bodies under the Convention, United Nations organizations, observers and other stakeholders to consider the recommendations referred to in paragraph 1 above and to take any necessary action, as appropriate and in accordance with their mandates



Possible actions by the KCI

No actions required, there is no relevant recommendations pertaining to CBs in the 2023 report

14. Other invitations



Matters relating to the Standing Committee on Finance (9/CMA.5, para 11)

Invites Parties, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, particularly from the private sector, to submit via the submission portal by 31 March 2024 their views on the issues to be addressed during the workshops

Gender and climate change (15/CP.28, para 2)

Invites Parties, United Nations entities, the UNFCCC constituted bodies and relevant organizations, in accordance with their respective mandates and priorities, to submit via the submission portal3 by 31 March 2024 their inputs on progress, challenges, gaps and priorities in implementing the gender action plan, categorized by deliverable or output for each activity under the gender action plan, and on future work to be undertaken on gender and climate change, with a view to the submissions informing the review referred to in paragraph 1 above (*final review of the implementation of the enhanced Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan*)

Terms of reference for the second review of the PCCB (12/CP.28, para 3, and 16/CMA.5, para 4)

Invites Parties, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, representatives of relevant processes under the Convention, and non-Party stakeholders to submit via the submission portal by 29 February 2024 views on the second review of the Paris Committee on Capacity-building based on the terms of reference contained in the annex for consideration by the Subsidiary Body for Implementation at its sixtieth session (June 2024)

Linkages between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism (10/CP.28, para 10)

Invites Parties, the UNFCCC constituted bodies, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism and other relevant stakeholders to submit via the submission portal by 1 February 2024 views on maintaining and enhancing collaboration and cooperation between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism, including on linkages between the Mechanisms, taking into account the guiding questions contained in the annex
