- KCI 9: considered a background note on incorporating relevant outcomes from the Glasgow Conference and the Sharm el-Sheikh Conference into the existing workplan of the forum and its KCI.
- The KCI requested the secretariat to prepare a concept note on the design and implementation of a capacity-building programme for Parties wishing to undertake an assessment of the impacts of the implementation of response measures.
- > The note should cover, inter alia:
- ➤a) Guidance on assessing and analysing the impacts of response measures, including as the impacts relate to decent work and quality jobs, and including economic, social, environmental, domestic, cross-border, positive and negative impacts;
- b) Facilitation of the development of case studies, as appropriate;
- C) Organization of targeted regional hands-on training workshops.

KCI secretariat, developed the concept note based on guidance and informed by capacity building practices by other workstreams in secretariat.

- $\,\circ\,$ Identifying the capacity building needs
 - a survey is proposed every three years to inform the development of modules and implement activities
 - Results will also be used as input to evaluate progress and plans for further capacity building
- $\,\circ\,$ Reaching the right audience
- $\,\circ\,$ Approach for capacity building
 - Use of array of tools such as courses (online and hybrid), workshops, direct technical assistance
 - Resource materials such as modeling tools (as much as licenses allow or limited versions), guidance documents, videos, and other materials
 - Enhance collaboration with other developmental organization to avoid duplication
 - Collaborate with other UN organisations, international organisations, regional stakeholders, RCCs
