### Annotations to the provisional agenda for the 14<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures

#### 1. Opening of the meeting

1. **Background:** According to the rules of procedure of the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures (KCI),<sup>1</sup> at least nine members must be present at a meeting to constitute a quorum.

2. **Action:** The KCI Co-Chairs will ascertain whether the members present constitute a quorum and, if so, open the meeting.

#### 2. Organizational matters

##### (a) Election of the Co-Chairs for 2026–2027

3. **Background:** According to its rules of procedure, following completion of the Co-Chairs' two-year term of office, the KCI shall nominate two members to serve as Co-Chairs for the next two-year term of office.

4. The KCI shall select its Co-Chairs on a consensus basis taking into account the need to ensure equitable geographical representation.

5. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to elect its Co-Chairs for 2026–2027. The appointments will be effective immediately and the newly elected Co-Chairs will be invited to preside over the meeting.

##### (b) Adoption of the agenda

6. **Background:** According to its rules of procedure, the KCI shall adopt the agenda at the beginning of each meeting. The provisional agenda for KCI 14 was prepared by the secretariat under the guidance of the KCI Co-Chairs and circulated among KCI members prior to the meeting.

7. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to adopt the agenda for the meeting.

##### (c) Organization of work

8. **Background:** KCI 14 will be held in Bonn from 4 to 5 June 2026 and will be open to attendance, as observers, by Parties and observer organizations, except where otherwise decided by the KCI. The meeting will be webcast live.

9. A tentative work schedule for the meeting, which was prepared by the secretariat under the guidance of the KCI Co-Chairs, presents a proposed order and indicative timeline for taking up the agenda items.

10. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of the proposed organization of work for the meeting.

**(d) Membership matters**

11. **Background:** The Conference of the Parties (COP) at its twenty-ninth session, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP) at its nineteenth session and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) at its sixth session adopted the updated rules of procedure of the KCI.<sup>2</sup>

12. At KCI 14, the secretariat will provide an update on the status of the membership of the KCI.

13. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of its membership status.

**3. Update on relevant meetings, events and initiatives**

**(a) Outcomes of the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Belém and activities of the Katowice Committee on Impacts**

14. **Background:** At KCI 7, the KCI agreed to include a standing item entitled “Update on relevant meetings, events and initiatives” in the agenda for its future meetings.

15. At KCI 14, the secretariat will present the main outcomes of the Belém Conference, particularly those relevant to the work of the KCI. This will include updates on events organized by the KCI and the secretariat relevant to the impacts of the implementation of response measures. The KCI Co-Chairs will report on their participation in relevant meetings and events. In addition, KCI members will be invited to share information on other relevant meetings, events or initiatives that they have participated in since KCI 13, including those related to activities in the workplan of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures and its KCI for 2026–2030.<sup>3</sup>

16. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of the information provided.

**(b) Outlook for 2026**

17. **Background:** At KCI 14, the secretariat will provide an overview of the intergovernmental process and work under the UNFCCC, including major events that will take place at the sixty-fourth sessions of the subsidiary bodies (SB 64) relevant to the work of the KCI and the planned activities of the KCI for SB 64 and COP 31.

18. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of the information provided.

**(c) Tracking progress of implementation of mandates for the Katowice Committee on Impacts**

19. **Background:** At KCI 10, the KCI agreed to use a tracking table as a monitoring system for tracking the progress of implementation of mandates of the KCI.

20. At KCI 14, the secretariat will provide an update on the progress of implementation of mandates of the KCI.

21. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of the information provided.

**4. Implementation of the workplan of the forum and its Katowice Committee on Impacts for 2020–2025<sup>4</sup>**

**(a) Enhance the capacity and understanding of Parties, through collaboration and input from stakeholders, on the assessment and analysis of the impacts of the implementation of response measures to facilitate the undertaking of economic diversification and transformation and just transition (activity 4)**

22. **Background:** The KCI was to implement this activity at its meetings held in conjunction with SB 52 and SB 63, with the following modalities: input from experts, practitioners and relevant organizations, and a technical paper. The KCI began implementing the activity at SB 52 and published a technical paper<sup>5</sup> as an output of its implementation. KCI 8 agreed on a strategy for implementing the activity for up until SB 63. KCI 10 agreed on a broad framework for the second technical paper for the activity. KCI 13 agreed to defer consideration of this agenda item to KCI 14.

23. At KCI 14, a member of the working group leading this activity will be invited to provide an update on the progress of its implementation, including in relation to the second technical paper.

24. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to:

(a) Consider the draft second technical paper with a view to finalizing it after KCI 14 and/or provide guidance, as necessary;

(b) Provide relevant recommendations and/or key findings, as applicable, for inclusion in the meeting report for consideration by the forum in accordance with the strategy agreed for implementing this activity.

**(b) Develop a case study in each of the five United Nations regions in accordance with activity 7 of the workplan (activity 12)**

25. **Background:** COP 28, CMP 18 and CMA 5 requested the forum and its KCI to implement the activities arising from the outcomes of the midterm review of their workplan for 2020–2025.<sup>6</sup> One of those activities to be implemented by the KCI is developing a case study in each of the five United Nations regions in accordance with activity 7 of the workplan. KCI 10 agreed on a strategy for implementing this activity.

26. At KCI 11, the KCI agreed to develop:

(a) A case study on understanding the implications of the energy transition on African economies: economy and jobs, in collaboration with the African Climate Policy Centre of the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa;

(b) A case study for India on impacts and incentives inherent in destination-based carbon pricing, in collaboration with the European Roundtable on Climate Change and Sustainable Transition;

(c) Case studies for Ghana on assessing the impacts of climate response measures for planning effective and just transition pathways, in collaboration with the University of Hohenheim;

(d) A case study on the impact of green transition policies on employment growth: sharing information on European policies and their respective impacts, including regional and global employment data and policies, sharing good practices, and providing possible policy recommendations, in collaboration with the European Commission;

(e) A case study on financing green growth: assessing the impacts of Brazil's largest financial mechanism (Plano Safra) on just transitions in the agriculture sector, in collaboration with Climate Strategies;

(f) A case study for Nigeria on applying climate-economy models to support economic diversification and job-rich resilient growth, in collaboration with the German Agency for International Cooperation.

27. At KCI 13, the KCI agreed to provide written inputs on draft case studies and requested its Co-Chairs to finalize and publish the following case studies prior to KCI 14, in consultation with the relevant working groups, taking into account those written inputs and the comments received at KCI 13:

(a) "Assessing the implementation of Brazil's Plano Safra on just transitions in the agricultural sector";

(b) "Understanding the implications of the energy transition on African economies: Economy and Jobs";

(c) "The impacts and incentives inherent in destination-based carbon pricing: An Indian case study".

28. At KCI 13, the KCI:

(a) Noted the progress in the development of the case study "Assessing the impacts of climate response measures for planning effective and just transition pathways: case study for Ghana";

(b) Considered the case study "Economic diversification and climate policy integration in Nigeria: A case study from Nigeria" and agreed to provide written inputs for its further development with a view to it being finalized at KCI 14;

(c) Provided comments on and requested the relevant working group to further develop the case study "Impacts of clean transition policies on employment in the European Union and European Union just transition policies" with a view to it being finalized at KCI 14.

29. At KCI 14, a member of each of the working groups leading the case studies referred to in paragraph 29 above will provide an update on progress, including on the revisions to the case studies on the basis of the comments provided by the KCI.

30. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to:

(a) Take note of the published case studies;

(b) Consider the revised draft case studies with a view to finalizing them;

(c) Provide relevant recommendations and/or key findings, as applicable, for inclusion in the meeting report for consideration by the forum in accordance with the strategy agreed for implementing this activity.

**5. Implementation of the workplan of the forum and its Katowice Committee on Impacts for 2026–2030<sup>7</sup>**

**(a) Prepare information for the technical assessment component of the global stocktake related to the impacts of the implementation of response measures with the process outlined in paragraphs 12–13 of decision 23/CMA.3 (paras. 8 and 24 of decision 19/CMA.1) (activity 2)**

31. **Background:** The KCI is to organize a technical workshop to prepare information for the technical assessment component of the second global stocktake related to the impacts of the implementation of response measures.

32. At KCI 14, the KCI will consider the timeline for the information collection and preparation component of the second global stocktake, including in relation to gathering, compiling and synthesizing information for its inputs to the technical assessment component, and discuss the organization of the technical workshop.

33. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to agree on the timing of the technical workshop and provide guidance to the secretariat on the preparations for it.

**(b) Assess and analyse the impacts, including socioeconomic impacts, of response measures to be implemented in order to achieve all outcomes of the global stocktake and different net zero scenarios and pathways (activity 5)**

34. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare a report, organize regional workshops and develop recommendations under this activity. The report is to be finalized by the 16<sup>th</sup> meeting of the KCI with a view to informing the second global stocktake. To support this work, the KCI is scheduled to hold an intersessional workshop in May 2026 to define the scope of and analytical work required for the report.

35. At KCI 14, the KCI will consider the progress of this activity, including the discussions at and outcomes of the intersessional workshop.

36. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to discuss and agree on the scope and framing of a study for the report under this activity and/or to provide guidance, as necessary.

**(c) Analyse, assess and report on the impacts of measures taken to combat climate change, including cross-border impacts, recalling Article 3, paragraph 5, of the Convention (activity 6)**

37. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare two reports and develop recommendations under this activity. The first report is to be finalized by SB 67. To support this work, the KCI is scheduled to hold an intersessional workshop in May 2026 to define the scope of and analytical work required for the first report.

38. At KCI 14, the KCI will consider the progress of this activity, including the discussions at and outcomes of the intersessional workshop.

39. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to discuss and agree on the scope and framing of a study for the first report under this activity and/or to provide guidance, as necessary.

**(d) Facilitate the exchange and sharing of experience and best practices among Parties, the secretariat and other international organizations on conducting impact assessments (activity 8)**

40. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare summary reports, organize in-session workshops and develop recommendations under this activity.

41. At KCI 14, the KCI will discuss the objectives and substantive focus of the in-session workshop to be held at SB 65 under this activity and consider the regional training workshops organized under activity 15, as applicable.

42. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to agree on the objectives and substantive focus of the in-session workshop and provide guidance to the secretariat on the preparations for it.

**(e) Develop a toolbox that can be customized to local circumstances, including methodologies, for Parties to use in identifying, assessing and addressing the impacts of response measures, and build capacity and share experience in relation to using the toolbox (activity 10)**

43. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare two reports and develop recommendations under this activity. The KCI is to finalize the toolbox, guidelines for using it and the first report by SB 67 with a view to the toolbox being used for capacity-building activities, thereafter.

44. At KCI 14, the KCI will be taking stock of the work already undertaken by the forum and its KCI to inform the development of a toolbox. This includes, among others, consider how outputs can be consolidated, structured and made accessible as a coherent and customizable toolbox, taking into account identified gaps, challenges, lessons learned, and diverse domestic and regional circumstances, and the possible development of guidelines or a manual for using the toolbox.

45. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to discuss and agree on next steps in relation to the development of the toolbox and to provide strategic direction to the secretariat on its subsequent use, as applicable.

**(f) Develop a case study in each of the five United Nations regions on just transition of the workforce and the creation of decent work and quality jobs and on economic diversification and transformation in order to understand the opportunities and challenges faced in planning and implementation, and share the findings among Parties and experts (activity 11)**

46. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare one case study per region and develop recommendations under this activity. Three case study reports are to be finalized by SB 67. To support this work, the KCI is scheduled to hold an intersessional workshop in May 2026 to define the scope of and analytical work required for the three reports.

47. At KCI 14, the KCI will consider the progress of this activity, including the discussions at and outcomes of the intersessional workshop.

48. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to discuss and agree on the scope and framing of three case studies and/or to provide guidance, as necessary.

*KCI/2026/14/11 Concept note on scope and framing of three case studies on just transition of the workforce and the creation of decent work and quality jobs and on economic diversification and transformation in order to understand the opportunities and challenges faced in planning and implementation*

**(g) Develop case studies to identify and analyse the social and economic impacts of economy-wide nationally determined contributions, covering all greenhouse gases, sectors and categories (activity 12)**

49. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare a report containing case studies and develop recommendations under this activity. The report is to be finalized by SB 67. To support this work, the KCI is scheduled to hold an intersessional workshop in May 2026 to define the scope of and analytical work required for the report.

50. At KCI 14, the KCI will consider the progress of this activity, including the discussions at and outcomes of the intersessional workshop.

51. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to discuss and agree on the scope and framing of case studies for the report and/or to provide guidance, as necessary.

**(h) Assess and compile guidelines for reporting, in the context of the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement, on the assessment and analysis of the impacts of the implementation of response measures on Parties with economies most affected by the impacts of response measures as referred to in Article 4, paragraph 15, of the Paris Agreement (activity 13)**

52. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare a report, organize a regional workshop and develop recommendations under this activity. The KCI is to finalize the report and recommendations in advance of the upcoming review of the modalities, procedures and guidelines,<sup>8</sup> which is to be undertaken no later than 2028 on the basis of experience in reporting, technical expert review and facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress, for the transparency framework for action and support referred to in Article 13 of the Paris Agreement.

53. Further, the COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested the KCI and the Consultative Group of Experts to collaborate on exploring ways to enhance the capacity of Parties to report on the impacts of the implementation of response measures.

54. At KCI 14, the KCI will discuss the overall approach to implementing this activity, including its framing and the method for identifying, assessing and analysing challenges and gaps related to reporting on the impacts of the implementation of response measures, as well as the approach to collaboration with the Consultative Group of Experts.

55. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to agree on the scope, framing and overall approach for this activity and provide guidance to the secretariat, as applicable.

**(i) Enhance the capacity of Parties to carry out their own assessment and analysis of and produce reports on the impacts of the implementation of response measures through training and capacity-building efforts, including existing initiatives (activity 15)**

56. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare a report, organize regional workshops and develop recommendations under this activity. The KCI will continue implementing its

capacity-building programme and finalize a report on capacity-building work undertaken and related recommendations by SB 69. The KCI will also develop an e-learning module, as part of capacity building programme, on just transition guidelines under activity 17.

57. At KCI 14, the KCI will take note of the progress of implementation of the capacity-building programme, including regional training workshops, and consider ways to strengthen capacity-building initiatives, including workshops and peer-to-peer learning exchanges, and promote use of the e-learning modules.

58. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to:

(a) Take note of the progress of implementation of the capacity-building programme and agree on approaches to strengthening capacity-building initiatives and promoting use of the e-learning course;

(b) Agree on scope and work to be undertaken to develop the e-learning module on just transition guidelines;

(c) Provide guidance to the secretariat, as applicable.

**(j) Identify and exchange experience on technological solutions aimed at reducing climate change impacts and creating decent work (activity 16)**

59. **Background:** The KCI is to prepare two technical papers and develop recommendations under this activity. The first technical paper and associated recommendations are to be finalized by SB 67.

60. At KCI 14, the KCI will identify focus sector(s) and technologies with a view to defining the scope of and analytical work required for the first technical paper.

61. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to discuss and agree on focus sector(s) and technologies and the scope of analytical work required for the first technical paper.

**6. Capacity-building programme aimed at assisting Parties in undertaking an assessment of the impacts of the implementation of response measures**

62. **Background:** COP 27, CMP 17 and CMA 4 requested the forum and its KCI to facilitate the enhancement of the capacity of Parties, in particular developing country Parties, to develop and use impact assessment methodologies and tools for conducting their own assessments and analyses of the impacts of response measures, including on decent work and quality jobs, and economic, social, environmental, domestic, cross-border, positive and negative impacts, which includes facilitating the development of case studies, as appropriate, and the organization of targeted regional hands-on training workshops<sup>9</sup>. They also requested the KCI to enhance the capacity of Parties, in particular developing country Parties, to develop and use country-specific tools and methodologies for assessing the environmental, social and economic co-benefits of climate change policies and actions.<sup>10</sup>

63. In response, KCI 11 agreed on a concept on capacity-building programme aimed at assisting Parties in undertaking an assessment of the impacts of the implementation of response measures and requested the secretariat to implement the programme, including through the UNFCCC regional collaboration centres and other organizations.

64. KCI 12 finalized two e-learning modules of the capacity-building programme and provided comments on the other six of the eight learning modules and requested the

secretariat to further develop them with a view to them being finalized by the end of 2025. The KCI agreed to consider a draft guidebook and a progress update at KCI 13.

65. KCI 13 agreed to defer consideration of this agenda item to KCI 14.

66. At KCI 14, a member of each of the working groups leading the work on each learning module, with the support of secretariat, will provide an update on the progress of development of each module, and the secretariat will present on the progress of implementation of the capacity-building programme.

67. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to:

(a) Take note of the progress of implementation of the capacity-building programme and provide any further guidance;

(b) Agree on approaches to strengthening capacity-building initiatives and promoting use of the e-learning course;

(c) Provide guidance to the secretariat, as applicable.

## 7. Communication and outreach strategy

68. **Background:** The KCI agreed on a communication and outreach strategy at KCI 6. At KCI 8, the KCI agreed to continue using its communication and outreach strategy and to review it in the future as necessary, as well as to review the key performance indicators at each KCI meeting.

69. At KCI 12, the KCI agreed to update, starting at KCI 13, its communication and outreach strategy, and also agreed, during the discussions on the capacity-building programme, to explore ways to leverage e-learning modules to enhance engagement of stakeholders, and to identify topics for webinars.

70. KCI 13 agreed to defer consideration of this agenda item to KCI 14.

71. At KCI 14, a member of the working group on communication and outreach will facilitate a discussion on this matter.

72. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to provide input for updating its communication and outreach strategy and identify topics for webinars.

## 8. Mainstreaming gender considerations

73. **Background:** At KCI 5, the KCI adopted approaches to integrating gender into its work, including by establishing an informal network of gender experts for response measures, and, at KCI 6, the KCI agreed to strive for both gender and regional balance when selecting experts, speakers and consultants for its work.

74. KCI 13 agreed to defer consideration of this agenda item to KCI 14.

75. At KCI 14, the KCI gender focal points, supported by the secretariat, will report on progress in mainstreaming gender considerations in the work of the KCI.

76. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of the information provided by the gender focal points and provide further guidance to secretariat on this matter, as applicable.

## 9. Rules of procedure of the Katowice Committee on Impacts

77. **Background:** COP 29, CMP 19 and CMA 6 adopted the updated rules of procedure of the KCI.<sup>11</sup> At the request of the secretariat, KCI 12 considered suggestions for their revision and it was agreed to further discuss this matter at KCI 13.

78. KCI 13 agreed to defer consideration of this agenda item to KCI 14.

79. At KCI 14, the secretariat will present suggestions for the revision of the rules of procedure.

80. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter and agree on revisions to the rules of procedure, as appropriate.

**10. Dates and venue of the 15<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Katowice Committee on Impacts**

81. **Background:** According to the functions, work programme and modalities of the forum and its KCI, the KCI shall meet two times a year, with the first meeting to be held over two days in conjunction with the sessions of the subsidiary bodies in the first sessional period of the year and the second meeting to be held intersessionally over three days.<sup>12</sup>

82. At KCI 14, the KCI Co-Chairs will provide an update on the dates and venue for KCI 15.

83. **Action:** The KCI will be invited to take note of the information provided.

**11. Other matters**

84. The KCI will be invited to consider any other matters raised at the meeting and agree on follow-up action, as appropriate.

**12. Closure of the meeting**

85. The KCI Co-Chairs will be invited to summarize the key outcomes of KCI 14 and close the meeting.
