Context

- ❑ **Mandate (decision 23/CMA.3):** KCI to submit by February 2022, with the assistance of the secretariat, a synthesis report reflecting the relevant work of both the forum and its KCI as an input to the technical assessment component of the first global stocktake.

Synthesis report content

Work of the forum and its KCI related to:

- ❑ The current state of, and progress towards enhancing understanding and addressing the impacts of, the implementation of response measures.
- ❑ Good practices and challenges in understanding and addressing the impacts of the implementation of response measures.
- ❑ Opportunities to further enhance understanding and address the impacts of the implementation of response measures.



Information in the report

Efforts by the forum and its KCI:

- ❑ **Knowledge products:** Technical papers by KCI and by secretariat, database for existing tools and methodologies.
- ❑ **Workshops:** In-forum training workshop on the use of economic modelling tools, workshop on economic diversification and just transition, regional awareness creation workshop.
- ❑ **Technical expert meetings:** KCI meetings, meetings for sharing experiences, case studies and best practices.
- ❑ **KCI meeting reports and annual reports**
- ❑ KCI's ongoing work: **compilation of concrete examples** on strategies, programmes or best practices on just transition and on economic diversification and transformation.



Information in the report

- ❑ Policies to **enhance international cooperation**:
 - Technical paper by KCI on capacity-building → mapping relevant stakeholders and their work and identified possible collaborations.
 - KCI's set of recommendations related to policy recommendations to enhance international cooperation for forum's consideration.
- ❑ **Good practices** in understanding and addressing the impacts of the implementation of response measures:
 - Sharing by experts at KCI meetings, in technical papers and at technical expert meetings.
 - KCI's set of recommendations was made based on the work of the KCI and the exchange of information and good practices (adopted at COP 26)



Challenges in understanding and addressing the impacts of the implementation of response measures:

- ❑ Shared by experts at KCI meetings, in technical papers and at technical expert meetings.
- ❑ Challenges revolve around:
 - Data (availability, capacity to collect).
 - Gaps in understanding impacts in assessment for country-, region- and sector-specific assessments.
 - No documents providing specific guidance on assessing social and economic impacts with a view to undertaking economic diversification and/or just transition.
 - Complexity with more sectors impacted.
 - Rebalancing the broad portfolio of national assets.
 - Provision of funding and mechanisms to support just transition

Information in the report

Opportunities to enhance understanding and addressing the impacts of the implementation of response measures:

- ❑ Opportunities identified during discussion at KCI meetings, in technical papers, at technical expert meetings and at workshops.
- ❑ Identified opportunities:
 - Strong regulatory framework for decarbonization and private sector competition for development and investment in green technology and therefore expand economic diversification.
 - Active labour-market policies to facilitate shift to green jobs.
 - Investing in new sectors that can provide productive capacity, which can also allow for export diversification.
 - Stakeholder engagement will allow governments to establish higher levels of ambition.
 - Investing in data collection.
 - Capacity-building partnerships and networks.
 - Technical paper on capacity-building identified collaboration opportunities.



Moving forward – First technical dialogue process

- ❑ Information note on the first meeting of the TD of the first GST under the Paris Agreement - Note by the co-facilitators (2 May 2022):



- ❑ Three meetings of the TD: SB 56 (TD1.1); SB 57 (TD1.2); SB 58 (TD1.3).
- ❑ Format for TD1.1:
 - 2 plenary sessions.
 - 3 roundtables for 3 thematic areas:
 - A World café format
 - A planned reception for informal interaction.
- ❑ Expertise to be brought to each of the roundtables and the world café by Parties and NPS:
 - Up to 60 technical experts from Party delegations across three roundtables.
 - Up to 45 non-Party participants across three roundtables from the nine NGO Constituencies and other NPS
