#### **Mandate**

- Mandates: (Annex II to decision 4/COP.25, 4/CMP.15 and 4/CMA.2)
  - Workplan activity 9- "Identify and assess the impacts of the implementation of response measures taking into account intergenerational equity, gender considerations and the needs of local communities, indigenous peoples, youth and other people in vulnerable situations"
  - Modalities "Technical paper"; "Input from experts, practitioners and relevant organizations"
  - Estimated timeline "SB 56 and SB 62 (2025)"
  - KCI 6 requested the working group to revise the technical paper for its consideration at next meeting, taking into account the comments and guidance provided by the KCI.



#### Comments received at KCI 6

- 1. The notion of "vulnerable groups" in the draft technical paper should be rephrased as "people in vulnerable situations".
- 2. In terms of people in vulnerable situations, the technical paper could expand its coverage to include **children**, **people living in energy poverty**, **and those without access to electricity or sanitation**.
- 3. The technical paper should provide **an overview on relevant information in the NDCs.**
- 4. The issue could be seen from the perspective of stakeholder engagement in policy making process.
- 5. Concerning mitigation policies examined by the technical paper, attention could be given to the effects of policy combinations on vulnerable peoples.
- 6. The literature review of the technical paper could include **the study conducted by ILO on issues related to gender equality and social just transition**.



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#### Revisions made to address the comments 1/2

- Replaced the notion of "vulnerable groups" with "people in vulnerable situations" throughout.
- 2. Expansion of coverage children, people living in energy poverty, and those without access to electricity or sanitation.
  - Children further research was done and relevant information about children was added (e.g. para. 42 and 46);
  - People in energy poverty reflected in policy a (energy efficiency measures) and c (renewable energy) and further added a note in the background (para.6);
- 3. The technical paper should provide an overview on relevant information in the NDCs.
  - The annex to the draft technical paper provided relevant paragraphs in the NDC synthesis report dated on 25 October 2021.
  - Added a bullet in the executive summary, summarizing the relevant key messages in the NDC synthesis report (para. 3).



#### Revisions made to address the comments 2/2

- The issue could be seen from the perspective of stakeholder engagement in policy making process.
  - Reflected in executive summary (para. 6) and conclusions (para. 91)
- Concerning mitigation policies examined by the technical paper, attention could be given to the effects of policy combinations on vulnerable peoples.
  - Reflected in the discussion on the impacts of carbon tax (para. 33).
- The literature review of the technical paper could include the study conducted by ILO on issues related to gender equality and social just transition.
  - Reflected in para. 48 50 and also listed the study in the References



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### **Proposed next steps**

#### Further work could be done:

- a. More research on the extended coverage to include children, people living in energy poverty, and those without access to electricity.
- b. Updating table 1 to reflect relevant revisions as above.
- c. Following a and b, further streamlining the paper.

- Continuation of the work on the technical paper after KCl 7, taking into account the comments and guidance provided at the meeting;
- Updating KCI on progress as appropriate
