Specific needs and concerns from non-Annex I Parties progress made on support programmes by Annex II Parties to meet the specific needs and circumstances of developing country Parties arising from the impact of the implementation of response measures

Decisions 2/C.P.17


- Detailed information by each Annex I Party on the assessment of the economic and social consequences of response measures.
- Information by each Annex II Party on the financial support for the purpose of assisting non-Annex I Parties to mitigate emissions and adapt to the adverse effects of climate change and any economic and social consequences of response measures, ...

Decisions 15/CMP.1 and 3/CMP.11

- Information by each Annex I Party (including Annex I Party without quantified emission limitation and reduction commitments for the second commitment) on how it is striving, under Article 3, paragraph 14, of the Kyoto Protocol, to implement its commitments in such a way as to minimize adverse social, environmental and economic impacts on developing country Parties
- Information by Each Annex I Party on how it strives to implement policies and measures in such a way as to minimize adverse effects, including the adverse effects of climate change, effects on international trade, and social, environmental and economic impacts on other Parties, especially developing country Parties.

Decisions 18/CMA.1 (ETF)

Information necessary to track progress on the implementation and achievement
of the domestic policies and measures implemented to address the social and
economic consequences of response measures by Parties with NDCs with
adaptation actions and/or economic diversification plans resulting in mitigation
co-benefits. Information includes:



 Detailed information by each Party on the assessment of economic and social impacts of response measures.






What are processes in place in your country or organization to systematically identify or collect information on social and economic consequences of impacts of implementation of response measures?




Guidance

These reports provide insights into the impacts on the Parties making the reports.








Challenges encountered in preparation for reporting impacts of response measures
