### **Background**



KCI 8 discussed the work undertaken by the working group regarding the potential impacts of relevant outcomes from the COP 26 and COP 27 to the work of KCI

KCI 8 also requested its Co-Chairs to prepare a concept note to propose how the KCI can incorporate the relevant outcomes listed in the background note into its existing work plan, as appropriate, for consideration at KCI 9.

#### Outcomes from COP26 and COP27:

- That relate to the work of the KCI.
- That speaks to all constituted bodies, and/or to any of the four areas of the work programme of the forum and potential actions by the KCI to integrate the outcomes into the existing workplan.

### **1. Report of the forum** (Decisions 20/CP.27 and 7/CMP.17, para 5, 20 and 32, 23/CMA.4, para 5, 21 and 33)



#### **Outcomes**

The COP, CMP and CMA requested the forum and its KCI to implement the following:

- To facilitate the enhancement of the capacity of Parties, in particular developing country Parties, to develop and use impact assessment methodologies and tools for conducting their own assessments and analyses of the impacts of response measures, including on decent work and quality jobs, and economic, social, environmental, domestic, cross-border, positive and negative impacts; this includes facilitating the development of case studies as appropriate and the organization of targeted regional hands-on training workshops.
- To develop and maintain a web-based user interface for selecting tools and methodologies and promote its use among Parties and stakeholders, as appropriate; a user manual for the interface could also be developed.

The COP, the CMP and the CMA requested the KCI to Enhance the capacity of Parties, in particular developing country Parties, to develop and use country-specific tools and methodologies for assessing the environmental, social and economic co-benefits of climate change policies and actions.

### Possible Actions by KCI

### The KCI to request the secretariat to:

- a) Prepare a concept note including through collaboration with other intergovernmental agencies, with KCI and regional collaboration centres, to design and implement a capacity building programme to assist Parties wishing to undertake assessment of impacts of impact of implementation of response measures to inter alia:
- (b) Develop and maintain a web-based user interface for selecting tools and methodologies from the existing database for tools for assessment of impacts of the implementation of mitigation policies and strategies (response measures),4 and draft a user manual for the interface.

conducting their own assessments and analyses of the impacts of response facilitating the organization of targeted measures, including on development of case regional hands-on decent work and quality studies as appropriate training workshops jobs, and economic, social, environmental, domestic, cross-border, positive and negative impacts; This concept note must complement the work undertaken for activities 32 and 43 of the workplan and will be prepared for its consideration at KCI 10

### 2. Glasgow Climate Pact (Decisions 1/CP.26, para 60)



### **Outcome**

The COP invited, among others, the CBs to consider how to integrate and strengthen ocean-based action in their existing mandates and workplans and to report on these activities within the existing reporting processes, as appropriate.



### Possible actions by the KCI

The broad framework of technical paper for workplan activity 4 to be agreed by the KCI at KCI 9 could include ocean-based actions as one of the elements to be covered

### **3. Matters relating to the SCF** (Decisions 5/CP.26, para 11, and 10/CMA.3, para 1)



#### **Outcome**

As part of recommendations from the determination of the needs of developing country Parties related to implementing the Convention and the Paris Agreement (NDR) among others, the COP invited CBs, in particular the PCCB and the Adaptation Committee, to consider the insights identified in the first NDR when implementing their respective workplans.

### Possible actions by the KCI

One identified need is capacity-building in the areas of research, training and education, awareness-raising, institutional strengthening and coordination, and policy development.

KCI9: The broad framework of TP for activity 4 to include elements on policy development relating to work areas of response measures

## 4. Annual technical progress reports of the PCCB for 2020 and 2021 (Decisions 12/CP.26 and 18/CMA.3, para 2) and Annual technical progress reports of the PCCB for 2022 (Decisions 19/CP.27 and 21/CMA.4, para 2)





- COP26: The COP and the CMA encourage CBs to continue their active engagement to facilitate greater coherence and coordination across their capacity-building-related work.
- COP27: The COP and the CMA encouraged bodies under and outside the Convention and the Paris Agreement to, among others, participate in and contribute to the follow-up work of the PCCB conducted each year after the Durban Forum, including an intersessional thematic webinar and a focus area day at the annual Capacity-building Hub, and take into consideration the findings of this follow-up work in their capacity-building work.

### Possible actions by the KCI

#### The KCI:

- To organize intersessional webinars, for different regions, on areas of the work programme with a view to enhance understanding and capacity of Parties on the subject matters.
- To participate at the annual Capacity-building Hub and organize an event relevant to the focus area day.

### **5. Glasgow work programme on ACE** (Decisions 18/CP.26 and 22/CMA.3, paras 4 and 11)



### **Outcomes**

#### The COP and the CMA:

- Adopted the 10-year Glasgow work programme on ACE. Under the priority area of policy coherence, efficient and effective ACE implementation can be enabled by inviting all CBs to include information on how ACE is implemented under their respective workstreams in their regular reports.
- Requested the SBI to, among others, hold an annual in-session ACE dialogue at its first regular session of each year with the participation of Parties, representatives of relevant CBs, and relevant experts, practitioners and stakeholders that focuses on the progress of implementation of the Glasgow work programme and on its four priority areas

Possible actions by the KCI

#### The KCI to:

- (a) Decide on reporting any relevant ACE elements in its meeting report or annual report;
- (b) Nominate a focal point for ACE to attend ACE dialogue on behalf of the KCI.

### **6. Action plan under Glasgow work programme on ACE** (Decisions 23/CP.27 and 22/CMA.4, annex)



#### **Outcomes**

The secretariat will lead the work on several deliverables:

- Identifying good practices for integrating the six ACE elements into the work of the UNFCCC CBs and reporting thereon in the annual summary report under the Glasgow work programme;
- Organizing a joint session with representatives of the CBs and all work programmes under the UNFCCC at the ACE Dialogue to discuss ways of enhancing understanding of the role of children and youth and indigenous peoples in accelerating ACE implementation and promoting intergenerational knowledge-sharing in the context of their work;
- Organizing an expert-run session on how to write strong project proposals at the ACE Dialogues to support the implementation of ACE activities.

### Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI to contribute to the deliverables once the work mandated to the secretariat starts

### 7. Gender and climate change (Decision 20/CP.26, paras 8 and 10)



### The COP encouraged:

### Parties and CBs to consider the case studies referred to in annual reports on gender composition for 2020 and 2021 and promote the full, meaningful and equal participation of women in the UNFCCC process.

- CBs to continue to strengthen their efforts in integrating gender considerations into their respective workstreams and promote coordination and coherence in the context of this work, taking into consideration the recommendations contained in the report on the progress of CBs in integrating gender considerations into their respective workstreams.
- Women's full, meaningful and equal participation women's full, meaningful and equal participation



**Outcomes** 



Possible actions by the KCI

- The KCI had agreed to strive for both gender and regional balance when selecting the experts, speakers and consultants for its work. The gender focal points of the KCI have also been reporting the progress in mainstreaming gender consideration at each KCI meeting.
- The KCI has also strived for inclusion of gender aspect in its activity outputs such as technical papers. The KCI to maintain that gender aspect be included in outputs it produces and in the implementation of workplan in general.

### **8. Sharm el-Sheikh Implementation Plan** (Decisions 1/CP.27, paras 28 and 29, and 1/CMA.4, paras 50 and 51)



#### **Outcomes**

The COP and the CMA emphasized that just and equitable transition encompasses pathways that include energy, socioeconomic, workforce and other dimensions, all of which must be based on nationally defined development priorities and include social protection so as to mitigate potential impacts associated with the transition, and highlights the important role of the instruments related to social solidarity and protection in mitigating the impacts of applied measures.

### Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI, as applicable, to discuss this matter after the CMA has decided on the work programme on just transition.





### **Outcomes**

The CMA established a work programme on just transition for discussion of pathways to achieving the goals of the Paris Agreement and to convene an annual high-level ministerial round table on just transition.



Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI, as applicable, to discuss this matter after the CMA has decided on the work programme on just transition.

## **10. Glasgow Climate Pact** (Decisions 1/CP.26, paras 20 and 52 and 1/CMA.3, paras 36 and 85) **and Sharm el-Sheikh Implementation Plan** (Decisions 1/CP.27, para 13, and 1/CMA.4, para 28)



### **Outcomes**

- The COP and the CMA called upon Parties to accelerate the development, deployment and dissemination of
  technologies, and the adoption of policies, to transition towards low-emission energy systems, including by rapidly
  scaling up the deployment of clean power generation and energy efficiency measures, including accelerating efforts
  towards the phasedown of unabated coal power and phase-out of inefficient fossil fuel subsidies, while providing
  targeted support to the poorest and most vulnerable in line with national circumstances and recognizing the need
  for support towards a just transition.
- The COP and the CMA also recognized the need to ensure just transitions that promote sustainable development and eradication of poverty, and the creation of decent work and quality jobs, including through making financial flows consistent with a pathway towards low greenhouse gas emission and climate-resilient development, including through deployment and transfer of technology, and provision of support to developing country Parties.

Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI to decide what support it can provide to Parties to ensure just transitions that promote sustainable development and eradication of poverty, and the creation of decent work and quality jobs



### **Outcomes**

### The COP and the CMA:

(i) recognized that the unprecedented global energy crisis underlines the urgency to rapidly transform energy systems to be more secure, reliable, and resilient, including by accelerating clean and just transitions to renewable energy during this critical decade of action

(ii) stressed the importance of enhancing a clean energy mix, including low-emission and renewable energy, at all levels as part of diversifying energy mixes and systems, in line with national circumstances and recognizing the need for support towards just transitions.

### Possible actions by the KCI

The KCI to decide what support it can provide to Parties towards just transitions.

### 12. Intermediate review of the implementation of the gender action plan (Decision 24/CP.27, para 7)





Following the technical paper prepared by the ILO exploring linkages between gender-responsive climate action and just transition for promoting inclusive opportunities for all in a low-emission economy, the COP invited the ILO to consider organizing a workshop or dialogue focused on the same topic.

Possible actions by the KCl

The KCI to participate in the workshop or dialogue at COP 28

### 13. Guidance for operationalizing the modalities, procedures and guidelines for the ETF (Decision 5/CMA.3,para 1)



### **Outcomes**

Adoption of the common tabular formats for the electronic reporting of the information necessary to track progress made in implementing and achieving NDCs and the training programme for technical experts participating in the technical expert review of BTR.

- <u>Table 12</u>: Reporting of information necessary to track progress on the implementation and achievement of the domestic policies and measures implemented to address the social and economic consequences of response measures.
  - Requires reporting of the social and economic consequences of RM, challenges in and barriers to addressing the consequences, and actions to address the consequences, for Parties with an NDC that consists of adaptation actions and/or economic diversification plans resulting in mitigation co-benefits.

### Possible actions by the KCI

- (a) KCI9: Call for inputs for activity 10 to be drafted in a way that they are linked to ETF.
- (b) At KCI 11- the KCI to invite Parties or stakeholders that have reported the information under ETF.
- (c) The outcome of the exchange and sharing of experience and best practices for this activity at KCI 11 to be documented in meeting report in a manner that links to ETF.
