





## Stocktaking - An Opportunity for Ambition for Children & Youth

## I. Background

The first Global Stocktake (GST) will be a critical component of COP28. It's the first time since the start of the implementation of the Paris Agreement that the world is undertaking a global assessment of the collective progress made to date and identifying critical challenges that need to be addressed to keep 1.5 within reach and leaving no one behind.

Local and subnational governments are recognized as essential actors in fast tracking transformative action in the urban world. Under the banner of #Stocktake4ClimateEmergency, hundreds of cities, towns, and regions are invited to host events throughout 2023 that provide an official contribution to the Paris Agreement's Global Stocktake.

To assess how international equity was being implemented, a Youth Stocktake report was launched at SB58 in a flagship event hosted by COP28 Presidency, the Youth Climate Champion team and YOUNGO. The aim of the Youth Stocktake is to assess the level of youth inclusion and youth-led policy implementation in the UNFCCC process, and forge a path forward for ensuring meaningful youth participation in climate change policy making while assessing the progress, and gaps of youth inclusion in, alongside the conclusion of the first GST.

By promoting collaboration between non-party stakeholders and local governments, we can unlock synergistic opportunities to fast-track climate action, while ensuring our approach is just, equitable, and considers present and future generations. The GST offers a chance to identify areas of improvement so that everyone, especially children and youth, can be included in decision making, contribute to climate goals and set the tone for collaborative messages for all stakeholders in the upcoming NDCs.







## **II. Objectives**

The session "Stocktaking - An Opportunity for Ambition for Children & Youth" as part of the Latin America and the Caribbean Climate Week aims to explore more in depth the importance of stocktake exercises as the world continues to address the devastating impacts of climate change. More specific details for the session include:

- Highlight the need of collectively work towards participation of all non-party stakeholders (NPS), with special emphasis on youth and other vulnerable and underrepresented stakeholders in the Global Stocktake process
- Give inputs into the Youth Stocktake report
- Promote participation in the Local Stocktakes
- Exploring synergies between those processes including the LCOYs and the RCOYs
- Promote progress on Intergenerational Equity considerations in the NDCs (including NAPs); including access to climate finance, and Children & Youth inclusion
- Discuss how local stocktake processes can better integrate youth participation and feed into the Global Stocktake
- Identify opportunities and challenges in enhancing climate action from a intergenerational, intercultural and gender perspective
- Identify possible measures, good practices on intergenerational cooperation
- Summarize key political messages, including recommendations for fostering youth action and enhancing support to youth led projects in LAC
