Opening of the workshop

The Technical workshop on the institutional arrangements of the Santiago Network of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage will open 4 May at 09:00hrs. Participants are kindly requested to arrive by 08:30hrs for registration formalities.

Meeting venue

The meeting will take place at UN City in Copenhagen which is located in Marble City and the address is Marmormolen 51, 2100 Copenhagen.

Owing to travel restrictions due to the Covid-19 pandemic, virtual participation will also be available. The meeting link will be shared to all registered participants in due course. Otherwise, the broadcast link (viewing only) will be available on the [event page](#).

How to get to the meeting venue

By car

If you arrive by car, underground public parking is available (8am-5pm 24 DKK/hr – 5pm-8am 12 DKK/hr). Please be aware, that a lot of construction work is going on at the moment, and the area may be difficult to access by car.

By train

We highly encourage you to use public transportation. If you arrive by train, you can take S-train line A, B, C, E, H and walk to Nordhavn Station.

Using public transportation, the approximate travel time from Copenhagen Central Station is 25 minutes while the travel time from Copenhagen Airport is around 45 minutes.

You can also use the Metro, please get off at Nordhavnen Station.

By taxi

The Danish name for UN City is FN Byen. That may be useful for a local Taxi-driver.



Identification badges and registration

For security reasons, only persons who have been registered for the in-person participation to the workshop will be given access to the building. All participants must bring a picture ID (passport or driver's license) everyday of the workshop and go through a security check. You are allowed to bring water bottles into the campus.

COVID 19 precautions measures

General COVID-19 restrictions no longer apply in Denmark. However, on board airplanes you may be met with requirements regarding COVID-19 certificate, and when visiting homes for the elderly, social institutions and hospitals you may be met with requirements regarding face masks.

Please be aware that businesses and private cultural institutions are allowed to make their own requirements regarding face masks, shields, COVID-19 Certificates etc. Please comply with such requirements.
