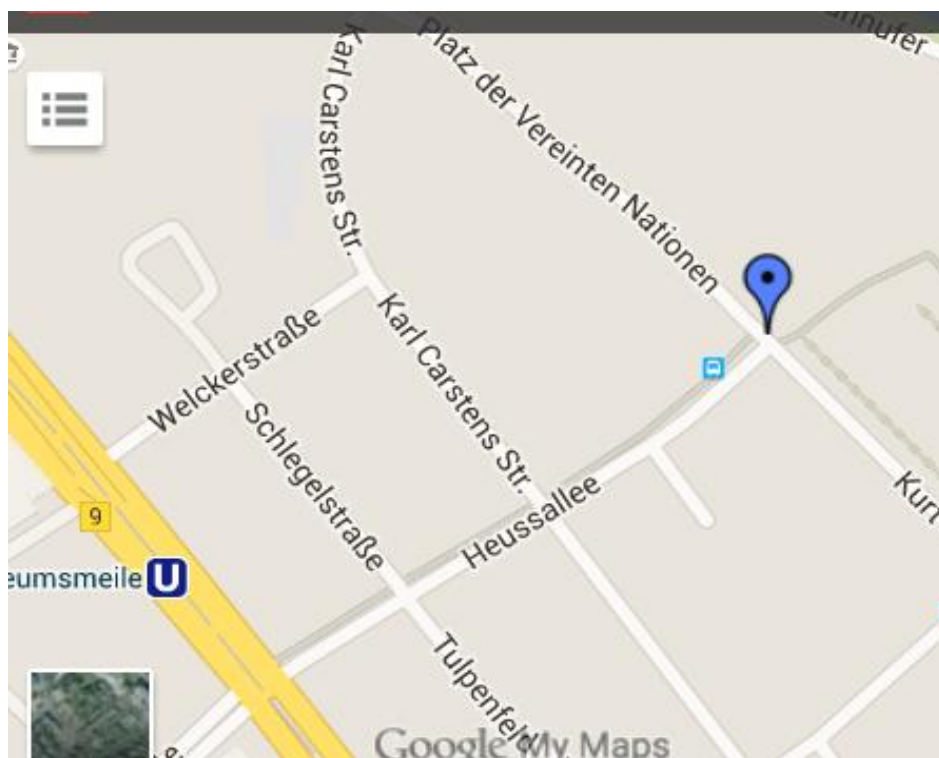

External visitors to the UNFCCC campus can enter the campus through the main gate at Platz der Vereinten Nationen 1. Please identify yourself to the security in charge as soon as you arrive. Please have your **passport** or **national ID** ready.



Registration

Registration will take place on **Thursday, 5 March 2020** from **8 to 9 a.m.** in the **AAH lobby**. Meeting badges will be issued at registration. Please provide your national passport as well as your original boarding passes for processing of DSA payment, if applicable.

The lead reviewers meeting will take place at the UN Campus (LEU Meeting Room 1916). Signs will be available to direct you when inside the building.

Daily subsistence allowance (DSA)

Funded participants are eligible for DSA in accordance with UNFCCC rules.¹ The DSA is calculated from the day of start of participation (arrival) to the day before the official departure plus terminal expenses amounting to USD 152 (USD 38 per airport terminal, which involves exiting the airport). Information on DSA for eligible participants was also provided along with the travel arrangements.

DSA payment will be organized on **Thursday, 5 March 2020; at the registration**. You can pick up your DSA in Euros at the **Westtours office** located on the **ground floor** in **Lauger Eugen (LEU)**. Please show your **passport** and hand-in the **DSA voucher** earlier received.

Catering

Please note that no other drinks, except for water, or food are allowed in the meeting room.

Transportation

FROM FRANKFURT AIRPORT

Frankfurt airport is approximately 160 km from Bonn. The intercity express (ICE) from Frankfurt stops at Siegburg station (10 km from Bonn central station). Trains leave from Frankfurt airport train station (long-distance/Fernbahn) two to three times every hour between 5 a.m. and 9 p.m. The train ride from Frankfurt airport to Siegburg takes approximately 40 minutes with ICE.

Please note that depending on your arrival terminal, you might have to take the sky train at the airport to get to the long-distance train station. The sky train is free of charge and is within the airport radius.

Tickets can also be purchased at the Deutsche Bahn information desk and ticket sales counters at the airport. You can pay with a credit card or in cash (Euro).

From Siegburg to Bonn city center

Travelling by tram

- No. 66, to Bonn Hauptbahnhof (approx. 25 minutes' ride, costs: 5.10 EUR).

Travelling by taxi

- The taxi fare from Siegburg railway station to Bonn center is approximately EUR 32.

From Siegburg to Bad Godesberg centre

Travelling by taxi

- The taxi fare from Siegburg railway station to Bad Godesberg centre is approximately 50 EUR.

¹ Note on travel for participants funded by UNFCCC secretariat: any changes made to the date of departure and/or arrival may incur a fee. Changes for private reasons are to be paid by the traveler. The UNFCCC secretariat will not be responsible for costs associated with any changes you may wish to make to your ticket, for example upgrading, re-routing or stop-over.



FROM DÜSSELDORF AIRPORT

Düsseldorf airport is approximately 90 km from Bonn. The train ride with the Regional Express (RE) to Bonn main station “Bonn Hauptbahnhof” takes approximately 1 hour 15 minutes. The sky train takes you to the airport railway station where you can take a train to Bonn. The sky train operates daily from 3.45 a.m. to 00.45 a.m. every 3.5–7 minutes between the terminal and main-railway line station. A bus transfer is guaranteed should the sky train not be operational. Buses depart from the station, level 0, every 20 minutes from 1.05 a.m. to 3.25 a.m. The journey to the terminal takes approximately eight minutes. The sky train accepts valid VRR and VRS tickets. Passengers who do not have either of these tickets must buy a ticket before travelling on the sky train or substitute bus service. Ticket vending machines are available at the platforms.

FROM BONN/COLOGNE AIRPORT

Travelling by bus

Cologne/Bonn airport is approximately 25 km from Bonn. The Airport Express bus SB 60 from Terminal 1 takes you to Bonn main station. Exit at “Bonn Hauptbahnhof” (Bonn Central Station). See description below on how to get to the UN Campus from Bonn center. The Airport Express bus SB 60 operates every 30 minutes on weekdays between Bonn and the airport and every 30 or 60 minutes on Saturdays and Sundays. (approx. 27 minutes’ ride, costs: 8.20 EUR). Some airlines offer a combined ticket that includes the bus ticket. The ticket can be purchased from the bus driver.



You can use this ticket as a “City ticket” to travel by bus or tram to your final destination within Bonn (Please validate your ticket at the **yellow validation machine** in the bus or tram in Bonn).

Travelling by train

The Regional-Express takes you to Bonn-Beuel Bahnhof. Get off at “Bonn-Beuel”. From “Bonn-Beuel” tram 62 (towards Dottendorf Quirinusplatz) takes you to “Bonn Hauptbahnhof”. See description below on how to get to the UN Campus from Bonn center.

GETTING AROUND THE CITY

The city's public transport system includes buses, trams (S-Bahn), subway (U-Bahn) and official taxis.

From Bonn city center (“Bonn Hauptbahnhof”) to UN campus

Travelling by subway (U-Bahn)

- Lines 16 or 63 towards Bad Godesberg (approx. 5 minutes’ ride, costs: EUR 3.60 for one-way trip. You can also buy multiple travel tickets (Mehrfahrtenkarte) and/or weekly tickets (Wochenkarte).



Get off at “Heussallee/Museumsmeile” stop. After you get off the tram, follow the signs to the UN Campus.

Travelling by bus

- Lines 610, 611: platform C4. Direction Heiderhof (approx. 10 minutes’ ride, costs: EUR 3.60).
Disembark at “Deutsche Welle” stop. The UN campus is right in front of you.

Travelling by taxi

- The taxi fare from Bonn city center to UN Campus (Platz der Vereinten Nationen) is about EUR 10. The central phone number for Bonn taxis is +49 228 555 555.

From Bad Godesberg centre to UN campus

Travelling by subway (U-Bahn)

- Line 16 towards Bad Godesberg/Koeln-Niehl, line 63 towards Bad Godesberg/Bonn Tannenbusch (approx. 10 minutes’ ride, costs: 3.60 EUR).
Get off at “Heussallee/Museumsmeile” stop. After you get off the tram, follow the signs to the UN Campus. Please walk along Heussallee until you see the main gate of the United Nations.

Travelling by bus

- Line 610 towards Duisdorf Bahnhof, line 611 towards Lessenich Sportplatz from “Bad Godesberg Bf/Rheinallee” (approx. 18 minutes’ ride, costs: 3.60 EUR).
Exit at “Heussallee” stop. After you get off the bus, follow the signs to the UN Campus.

Travelling by taxi

The taxi fare from Bonn Bad Godesberg to the UN Campus (Platz der Vereinten Nationen) is about EUR 10.

| Value added tax (VAT): | Prices for goods and services include VAT of 19% for regular goods and 7% for food, books and hotel accommodation with breakfast or meals. If permanent residence is outside the European Union, a large portion of the VAT may be refunded provided shopping is done at stores displaying 'Tax-Free for Tourists' signs by completing tax-free form and presenting it to the custom officials at the airport before checking in. Said form, after being checked and stamped by the officials should be taken to specific counters for cash refund |
