INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS

1. THE MEETINGS

The 37th meeting of the Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG 37) will take place from 6 to 8 February 2020. The meeting with organizations will start on 7 February from 14:00hrs.

The stocktaking meeting on the work of the Least Developed Countries Expert Group will be held from 9 to 12 February 2020.

Special note: Please note that a field trip to Andasibe National Park is planned to take place on the first day of the meeting on 9 February 2020. Departure from the venue is 09:00hrs. Further details will be provided at the venue. Please arrive on time as we shall leave promptly on time.

2. VENUE

Both meetings will be held at Hotel Carlton, Antananarivo, Madagascar. The hotel is located on the banks of Anosy Lake, a 10 minutes walk from the historical centre of Antananarivo, and a 25 minutes drive from Ivato International Airport.

Information for funded participants

Funded participants are kindly requested to bring their passports and boarding passes with them on the first day of their respective meeting in order to facilitate DSA payment. Travel for eligible funded participants to and from Antananarivo will be arranged at the lowest cost and most direct economy fare. The UNFCCC secretariat will not be responsible for costs associated with any changes that the funded participants may wish to make to their tickets, for example: upgrading, re-routing or stopovers.

Insurance

Participants are strongly advised to obtain international travel and medical insurance to cover the period of their departure for the event until the time of their return to their home country. The United Nations and the UNFCCC secretariat disclaim all responsibility for medical accident and travel insurance, for compensation, death or disability, loss or damage to personal property and for any other costs or losses that may be incurred during travel time or the period of participation at the meetings.

4. REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY INTO MADAGASCAR

Passport

Participants are required to hold an original, signed passport that is valid for six months beyond their stay in Madagascar, with at least three blank passport pages available for a Madagascar visa stamp. Amendment pages in the back of the passport are not suitable for Madagascar visas.

Yellow fever vaccination certificate

For visitors who stayed the last six (06) days in infected countries

Visa

All foreign nationals must obtain a visa to enter Madagascar.

Participants with Madagascar embassies or consulates are encouraged to apply in advance.

For all travellers to Madagascar, Non-Immigrant visas (Maximum stay: 90 days) can be obtained at all Malagasy international airports or harbours upon arrival. A note is attached to facilitate travel from your respective points of origin.

Below are required documents to apply for the visa upon arrival. Please read carefully and have these ready with you in case you will need to apply for a visa at the port of entry:

- Visa fee of USD 30–40;
- Completed application form obtainable at the port of entry;
- Two (02) recent passport photos;
- Return air ticket;
- Passport valid for at least six (6) months from intended return date, with at least three (3) blank pages;
- Yellow fever vaccination certificate for visitors who stayed the last six (06) days in infected countries.

5. TRANSPORTATION FROM THE AIRPORT TO THE HOTELS

Participants are responsible for organizing their own transportation from the Ivato International Airport and their Hotels.

Participants arriving from the Ivato International Airport are advised to take the white taxis from the airport to their respective hotels. These are easily identifiable upon exiting the airport terminal. For orientation, the price from the airport to Hotel Carlton is approximately USD 25. All taxis are not metered. Please arrange price before departure. You can also negotiate with your hotel for the airport transfer.

7. FURTHER INFORMATION

Geography

Madagascar is an island in the Indian Ocean off the eastern coast of southern Africa, east of Mozambique. It is the fourth largest island in the world. The capital Antananarivo is in the Hauts Plateaux near the centre of the island. It has a total area of 587,040 square kilometres (226,660 sq mi) with 581,540 square kilometres (224,530 sq mi) of land and 5,500 square kilometres (2,100 sq mi) of water.



Climate

- April to October: Dry season
- June to August: Austral winter period, cold evenings and nights
- Mid-November to March: Rainy season, Cyclone season, rains are heavy but short

Health considerations

It is recommended that you consult the appropriate health authorities in your country in connection with possible vaccinations and health precautions for Madagascar. The following vaccines are recommended by http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/destinations/traveler/none/madagascar for most travellers to Madagascar:

<u>Hepatitis A</u>: It is recommended for all travellers. Hepatitis A can be contracted in Madagascar through contaminated food or water, regardless of where you eat or stay.

<u>Typhoid</u>: typhoid can be contracted through contaminated food or water in Madagascar. Therefore, this vaccine is recommended to most travellers, especially if you are staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or if you are an adventurous eater.

There is no risk of yellow fever in Madagascar. The government of Madagascar requires proof of yellow fever vaccination only if you are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever. Additionally, there is a risk of Malaria in all areas of Madagascar, except rare cases in the city of Antananarivo. Remember that the best precaution is not to be bitten by mosquitoes. If traveling to area with a malaria risk, wear long trousers and long-sleeved shirts in the early mornings and evenings and wear insect repellent. Language

Malagasy is the official language in Madagascar that makes the country unique compared to other Francophone countries. French, as well as English, is spoken by many people.

Electricity voltage

The 220 Volt is generalized in Madagascar, with type E / F sockets:



Banking

Bank branches are present in the main cities of the country. They are open from 8:00 to 16:00, and many of them are equipped with ATM machines accepting international cards like VISA and MASTERCARD. Money transfer is also possible through Western Union.

Banks are open from Monday through Friday except holidays as they close their operations in the late morning. However, ATMs are always available for use.

Currency

The official currency is the Malagasy Ariary (MGA). Exchange rates as at 20 January 2020 are: 1 EUR = 4136.10 MGA

1 DOLLAR USD = 3721.82 MGA

Participants may obtain local currency at foreign exchange bureaus, bank kiosks or at the airport. Visa and Master Credit Cards are widely accepted in major hotels and establishments and only 4 numbers are accepted for the code. Passports are required for visitors' transactions and nominal commissions may be charged.

Time Zone

Madagascar is GMT +3.

The international dialling code of Madagascar is +261.

Dress code

Participants may dress casually during the meetings.
