A feminist economist with over 20 years' experience working on economic development, macroeconomic & trade and finance issues, with a focus on gender equality and women's empowerment and social equity, external debt and finance and more recently on climate change issues. Williams publications include: *Gender and Climate Financing: Coming Out of the Margin* (Routledge 2015), 'Africa and the World Trade Organization' in Nagar et. al. *Africa and the World: Global Politics, Diplomacy, and International Relations* (I.B Tauris, 2017), *Promoting sustainable development by addressing the impacts of Climate change response measures on developing countries*, (with Martin Khor et.al.) (South Centre, 2017), *Trading Stories: Experiences with Gender and Trade* (with Marilyn Carr) (Commonwealth Secretariat, 2009) and *Gender Issues in the Multilateral Trading System.
