Africa and the World: Global Politics, Diplomacy, and International Relations (I.B Tauris, 2017), Promoting sustainable development by addressing the impacts of Climate change response measures on developing countries, (with Martin Khor et.al.,) (South Centre, 2017), Trading Stories: Experiences with Gender and Trade (with Marilyn Carr) (Commonwealth Secretariat, 2009) and Gender Issues in the Multilateral Trading System. Mariama is also a Lead Author for chapter 15, Investment and Finance, Working Group III (Mitigation), the Sixth Assessment Report (AR6) of the Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC).
