#### PRESS CONFERENCE HUMAN MOBILITY AND CLIMATE CHANGE AT COP23

#### 3.00pm, Tuesday 7 November Press Conference Room 1 Theatre, BULA ZONE 3

Human mobility (displacement, migration and planned relocation) related to disasters and the adverse effects of climate change is one of the biggest challenges facing States, communities and CSOs in the 21st century. According to the Norwegian Refugee Council's Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre (IDMC), sudden-onset disasters displace an average of 25 million people a year. That is equivalent to someone being forced to flee their home every second. At the same time, rising seas, drought, and other 'slow-onset' changes are eroding people's land, livelihoods and security, and magnifying existing vulnerabilities.

While climate change affects us all, the risks of displacement are significantly higher in lower-income countries and among people in living in poverty. Women, children, older and indigenous peoples and other vulnerable groups are also disproportionately affected.

However, much can be done to minimize the risk of displacement linked to climate change, and to guarantee rights and protections for people who are forced to move.

This press panel will feature several lead organizations working to address displacement in the context of climate change, including members of the WIM Task Force on Displacement, established in Paris at COP21. Speakers will provide insights into human mobility and climate change, update on actions, and outline progress needed under the Paris Agreement, new Global Compacts on Migration and Refugees, and Sendai Framework.
