Event Overview

The lab will bring together 'macro' institutional efforts to address Physical Climate Risk, 'micro' solutions that are already being demonstrated in this area, particularly in the global south, along with innovative financing vehicles and projects that help funds flow in between the macro and micro — with the hope that this dialogue can further enable bringing these actors together — that is to scale up the lessons learned from the micro solutions, to be addressed at the macro level where risks are aggregated and enable the flow of data and capital between the two.

The following will be presented by participants in a 'Ted Talk' format, with emphasis on delivery as opposed to slides, with breakout groups reporting feedback to the broader group and next steps being discussed and decided by a facilitated roundtable discussion at the end.

- Showcase of data and digital solutions to address physical climate risk using financial technology in the global south
- Examples of funds and innovative solutions

'The Sharm El Sheikh Adaptation Outcomes' for financing resilience

The high-level climate champions have worked with BCG in formulating a number of adaptation outcomes to be released at COP 27. This implementation lab will look to address the following solution.

'Private sector integrates physical climate risks into investment decisions and continues to innovate mechanisms for financing A&R so as to enable the mobilization of the \$140 to \$300B by 2030 that will be needed across both public and private sources'

Context

Context: This event hopes to provide a rapid-fire overview of action across the globe on financing adaptation and resilience with interested actors from diverse backgrounds in the hopes of achieving radical collaboration that will last well beyond the session in working to achieve the adaptation outcomes.

Speaker presentations
