Concept note by the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies for the pre-sessional workshop on the work programme for urgently scaling up mitigation ambition and implementation in this critical decade referred to in paragraph 27 of decision 1/CMA.3

5 November 2022 | 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. | meeting room 2, Sharm el-Sheikh International Convention Centre, Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt

I. Background

1. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) decided, at its third session, to establish a work programme to urgently scale up mitigation ambition and implementation in this critical decade. The CMA further requested that the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) recommend a draft decision on this matter for consideration at CMA 4, in a manner that complements the global stocktake.¹

2. At SB 56, the SBSTA and the SBI took note of the constructive discussions held at those sessions under the joint agenda item on matters relating to the work programme referred to in paragraph 1 above and agreed to continue work thereon at SB 57 with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 4. The SBSTA and the SBI invited Parties to submit via the submission portal views on the work programme.²

3. The SBSTA and the SBI further requested the secretariat to organize, under our guidance, the pre-sessional workshop on the work programme referred to in paragraph 1 above open to all Parties prior to CMA $4.^3$

II. Pre-sessional workshop

4. The full-day pre-sessional workshop will be held under our guidance on 5 November 2022 in Sharm el-Sheikh prior to the start of SB 57.

5. The pre-sessional workshop on the work programme referred to in paragraph 1 above will be an opportunity for Parties and groups of Parties to better understand views on the work programme, including those shared during previous discussions and in the submissions.⁴ We would like the workshop to be a space for informal, open

and constructive engagement where views on matters and questions related to the work programme can be shared and exchanged in order to enhance understanding and prepare for the formal deliberations on the work programme at SB 57.

6. The workshop will be open to representatives of Parties and groups of Parties, as well as representatives of observer organizations registered for COP 27 on a non-objection basis.

7. Each session of the workshop has been designed to facilitate greater understanding of the views of Parties and groups of Parties on the work programme, including those expressed at SB 56 and in the submissions.

8. We welcome participants to an open and constructive exchange. The workshop will serve as a facilitative, informal and preparatory platform for the work to take place at SB 57 on the work programme. Views and ideas shared will not prejudge outcomes from the formal deliberations but serve as a source of inspiration and motivation for the important work ahead of us at SB 57.
