First Biennial Transparency Report

- Maldives submitted its first Biennial Transparency Report on 16 Nov 2024
- The BTR process established a clearer picture of our emissions profile, NDC progress, mitigation and adaptation efforts, and support needed and received
- **Challenges**
 - Short Duration for Report Compilation and Validation
 - Capacity Constraints and Institutional Memory
 - Limited Institutionalized Data Collection Procedures and Data Culture
 - Coordination across implementing agencies and partners
- **Lessons learned**
 - Periodic and timely support is essential for a sustainable and structured approach to climate reporting
 - Importance of Continuous capacity building and orientation of team members on ETF tools and understanding the MPGs
 - Establishing a long-term ETF reporting team and improving coordination between institutions



Improvements in ETF reporting

- **Develop regulations governing GHG inventory and mitigation data collection, climate finance tracking, and carbon markets**
- **Establish a centralised data management system for mitigation and adaptation data**
- **Equip experts with tools and training to meet Enhanced Transparency Framework requirements**
- **Strengthen institutional arrangements and capacity within line ministries and agencies to improve data collection and reporting**
- **Maintain GHG and NDC tracking guidelines to preserve institutional memory and ensure continuity**
- **Strengthen climate finance tracking with a clearer breakdown across mitigation, adaptation, and loss and damage**

Transparency systems provide a stronger evidence base for national planning and policymaking, enabling more targeted climate action
