**It Takes Roots' Delegation Respond to White House Stance on  
Climate Mitigation and Adaptation.**

*After Organizing Two Non-Violent Demonstrations Within The UN Climate Talks, North, South  
and Latin American Grassroots Organizations Hold Press Conference to Comment on the  
United States' Position on Climate Change at COP23 in Bonn, Germany.*

Bonn, Germany -- In the past 3 days, the It Takes Roots Delegation comprised of the [Global Grassroots Justice Alliance](#), [Indigenous Environmental Network](#), Climate Justice Alliance, have co-organized two demonstrations that challenge decision-makers both at the state and nationally level.

On Monday, November 13th, the Trump Administration held it's only event at COP23 and promoted coal and nuclear energy. On Saturday, Governor Jerry Brown, launched "The American Pledge" a campaign which promotes carbon trading as a climate solution.
