Biennial nomination of co-facilitators of the Ocean and Climate Change Dialogue 2023–2024

Dear Colleagues,

Further to the mandate provided to me by Parties in the Sharm el-Sheikh Implementation Plan (Decision 1/CP.27, paragraph 45)¹, I am pleased to inform Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, United Nations organizations and admitted intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations that I have appointed Julio Cordano (Chile) and Gwynne Taraska (USA) as co-facilitators for 2023–2024 of the ocean and climate change dialogue.

The co-facilitators will be responsible for deciding the topics for and conducting the dialogues in 2023–2024, in consultation with Parties and observers, and preparing an informal summary report to be presented in conjunction with the subsequent session of the COP each year. The appointed co-facilitators are well versed in the UNFCCC process and the global ocean-climate agenda, having been actively engaged in addressing matters under and outside the Convention and the Paris Agreement on these matters.

I would encourage Parties and observers to work closely with the appointed co-facilitators to deliver dialogues that will strengthen ocean-based climate action, including in Parties' national climate goals and in the implementation of these goals.
