# Topics to be discussed at dialogues under the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme in 2023

The Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement requested the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies to appoint two co-chairs for the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme. We are honoured to have been appointed by the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies to co-chair the work programme in 2023–2024.

As the co-chairs of the work programme, we have been tasked with guiding the secretariat in organizing at least two global dialogues this year, with one to be held prior to the first regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies of the year and one prior to their second regular sessions, as well as other dialogues as necessary held in conjunction with existing events, such as the regional climate weeks, in addition to holding investment-focused events on the margins of these dialogues.<sup>1</sup>

We have also been tasked with deciding on the topics to be discussed under the dialogues this year, considering submissions on suggested topics in line with the scope of the work programme from Parties, observers and other non-Party stakeholders.<sup>2</sup> We are pleased to communicate that the dialogues taking place under the work programme in 2023 will focus on **accelerating just energy transition**, including by:

- Implementing policies and measures with global overview and country-specific experience;
- Addressing financial, technological and capacity-building needs in this area, such as through
  international cooperation, including with non-Party stakeholders, and provision of support to
  developing countries;
- Promoting sustainable development and understanding socioeconomic effects.

The first global dialogue and the first investment focused event will be organized in conjunction with SB 58. We would like to encourage Parties, observers and other non-Party stakeholders to submit their views on opportunities, best practices, actionable solutions, challenges and barriers relevant to the topics of the dialogues via the submission portal<sup>3</sup> no later than four weeks before each dialogue.<sup>4</sup>
