## Key messages relating to enhancing access to climate finance from the 2017 LTF workshop (1/4)

### **Developing countries could consider:**

- Assigning a greater role to focal points of the different climate funds to ensure greater country ownership and coherence
- Enhancing their engagement with non-government stakeholders to improve access to climate finance
- Increasing their efforts to identify and communicate opportunities for private finance, particularly with regard to adaptation finance



## Key messages relating to enhancing access to climate finance from the 2017 LTF workshop (2/4)

### Multilateral climate funds should continue their efforts

- To simplify their accreditation procedures and access modalities
- To enhance the readiness of recipient countries
- To improve communication between the funds and recipient countries
- To better articulate their comparative advantages and what support they can offer to the private sector



# Key messages relating to enhancing access to climate finance from the 2017 LTF workshop (3/4)

# Providers of international support should continue their efforts:

- To build their support on existing national systems and institutional knowledge
- To target their support to recipient countries' needs
- To enhance coordination at the country level
- To strengthen coordination to enhance complementarity and avoid overburdening the administrations of recipient countries



# Key messages relating to enhancing access to climate finance from the 2017 LTF workshop (4/4)

# Providers of international support should continue their efforts (continued):

- To assist countries across the whole project cycle
- To fill gaps in capacity-building and technical assistance for the development of policies, policy frameworks and project pipelines in developing countries

### Objective

 Collect views and insights on the mandated themes, to inform the workshop discussions with experiences from country representatives and practitioners

### **Activities undertaken**

- The secretariat organized a mini-workshop on the LTF insession workshop themes during the following events:
  - Three GCF Structured Dialogues organized in Latin America, Asia and Africa;
  - Climate Change Expert Group Meeting organized by the Union for Mediterranean.

#### Views and insights gathered from the outreach activities (1/3)

- There is not enough information to navigate the complex climate finance architecture to identify the resources needed
- There needs to be a platform to exchange lessons learnt in utilizing **direct access** modality
- In-country climate finance coordination mechanism plays an important role in facilitating financing priority projects and programmes.
- **Opportunities for private sector** should be more clearly articulated, especially for the small, local companies

#### Views and insights gathered from the outreach activities (2/3)

- There is a need for the climate funds to harmonize and to simplify the terms used in project policy and requirements.
- Consistency in the application of project policies should be ensured within the climate funds.
- The climate funds should show greater flexibility with the technical data requirements
- **Project requirements should be differentiated** depending on the type and scale of project being proposed

#### Views and insights gathered from the outreach activities (3/3)

- **Understanding the context** (e.g. COP decisions) of the climate funds' policies is important in developing projects.
- Stand-alone capacity-building projects on climate change should be supported by the climate funds to strengthen the capacity of countries to implement projects and programmes
- Capacity-building should be long-term, across the entire project cycle
