# INTRODUCTION TO NAP PROCESS IN UGANDA

- □ Strengthening Adaptation Planning in Uganda (SAP)" was approved by GCF on 30 June 2021 (Grant Effectiveness Date) with a total
- □Budget of USD \$ 2.9 Million.
- □Duration: 3.5 Years

## Two Main Objectives of the NAP

- 1. Reducing vulnerability to the impacts of climate change, by building adaptive capacity and resilience;
- 2. Facilitate the integration of climate change adaptation, in a coherent manner, into relevant new and existing government plans, policies, and programs, in particular development planning processes and strategies within all relevant sectors and at different levels, as appropriate.

#### The 4 Outcomes

- □Outcome 1: Adaptation planning governance and coordination strengthened
- □Outcome 2: Strengthened capacity for NAP planning and for future NAP processes.
- □Outcome 3: Finance for adaptation secured
- □Outcome 4: Lessons learned from NAP process disseminated
- □The NAP process is inclusive and takes a whole of government and society approach
