Arab Regional Strategic Plan

Communalities and contingencies in strategies and action plans

- Recognition of CC impacts as a key challenge to sustainable development:
 Development under tougher conditions.
- Adaptation and mitigation.
- Adaptation is clearly set as a priority for the region. Mitigation mostly conditional to CF- Flow.
- Differential progress in mainstreaming CC. Nuancing the needs while taking a regional stand.
- Dedicated institutions to coordinate climate action in most countries
- Faster progress in assessment of impact compared to implementing CC policies.
- "Doing what we are already doing with an incremental investment to make economies and environment climate-proof and countries more resilient."

Arab Climate Change Action plan

- A master document for climate action in the region under the CAMRE 2012 revised in 2017
- Timeframe: 10 years
- Drafted based on countries demands and international guiding documents
- Sets strategic choices, priorities, targets and needs.
- Taking into considerations all sectors priorities
- Inclusive, as .gov .com and .org took part in the preparation process and are committed to partake the implementation
- A compilation of 18 priority projects outlines covering all sectors

Objectives

 General: To take adequate measures to address CC impact and limit its impacts: Political, social, economic and environmental

Strategic:

- 1. preparedness through adaptation
- 2. Voluntary contribution to mitigation in line with International efforts to reduce emissions within the Int'l conventions and agreements. Conditional to commitments of DC to provide CF CD and TT.
- 3. Protection of the Natural resources and livelihoods from CC impacts
- 4. Enhance the pace of SD implementation
- 5. Strengthen the capacities of national and regional institutions to address CC impacts
- 6. Creating the enabling environment to enhance regional and Int'l cooperation to support and serve the national programs



Outline of Process

Working group composed of key partner organisations, chaired: LAS

- 1. Working group members: ACSAD, ACWUA, AOAD, AWC, CEDARE, ESCWA, FAO, RAED, UNESCO, UNICEF
- 2. Group met as a group and virtually (through internet)
- 3. Group identified 31 projects initially
- 4. Many similarities, group clustered the project into 7 topics
- The Partner organisation elaborated project concept notes
- 6. These were reviewed at a meeting in Cairo on 16th April
- 7. Final versions were then edited and compiled by the ACCWaM Consultant

Regional Vs National

- Regional processes and documents are guiding not binding
- The processes in addressing CC at regional and national levels are complementary and not competing or mutually exclusive: CC impacts are regional by nature and shall be addressed better/effectively in a regional framework
- Regional approach is enhancing elements in the regional integration (Economic and political)

Concluding remarks of relevance to the objectives of the inception workshop

- Reach out to CC FP in countries for a better scan of the needs, measures, institutions to map out NBF
- Reach out to organizations that do similar work from a sectoral standpoints and have already generated valid knowledge products ready to use
- Make sure the final findings of the inception workshop are validated to ensure ownership of the process and the final outcome
- LAS is keen to support the next steps in process in partnership with ESCWA UNFCCC and countries
